**socializing** The action or process of causing a person to behave in a way that is acceptable to their society.

- abidance**      The act of dwelling in a place.
- accept**        Make use of or accept for some purpose.  
*They **accepted** the need to cut overheads.*
- accordance**    The act of granting rights.  
*There is good **accordance** between the values.*
- agree**         Consent or assent to a condition or agree to do something.  
*White wine doesn't **agree** with me.*
- agreement**    The verbal act of agreeing.  
*The two officers nodded in **agreement**.*
- centrist**       A person who holds moderate political views.  
*A **centrist** politician.*
- compliance**   The action or fact of complying with a wish or command.  
*This paper estimates the **compliance** costs of such a policy change.*

<b>comply</b>	Act in accordance with a wish or command. <i>You must <b>comply</b> or else.</i>
<b>conform</b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The pressure to <b>conform</b>.</i>
<b>conformism</b>	Orthodoxy in thoughts and belief.
<b>conformist</b>	A person who conforms to accepted behaviour or established practices. <i>Organizations where employees are loyal without being unthinking <b>conformists</b>.</i>
<b>conformity</b>	Compliance with standards, rules, or laws. <i>A word of praise or an encouraging smile provide rewards for <b>conformity</b> to social norms.</i>
<b>congratulate</b>	Pride or congratulate oneself for an achievement. <i>The operators are to be <b>congratulated</b> for the service that they provide.</i>
<b>congressional</b>	Of or relating to congress. <i>The <b>congressional</b> agricultural committees.</i>
<b>democratic</b>	Relating to or supporting democracy or its principles. <i><b>Democratic</b> government.</i>
<b>enjoin</b>	Issue an injunction. <i>The code <b>enjoined</b> members to trade fairly.</i>
<b>equity</b>	The difference between the market value of a property and the claims held against it. <i>If there is any conflict between the principles of common law and <b>equity</b> <b>equity</b> prevails.</i>
<b>feudalistic</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of feudalism.
<b>follow</b>	Follow in or as if in pursuit. <i>The six years that <b>followed</b> his restoration.</i>
<b>institution</b>	A hospital for mentally incompetent or unbalanced person. <i>About 5 per cent of elderly people live in <b>institutions</b>.</i>
<b>interaction</b>	A mutual or reciprocal action; interacting. <i>Ongoing <b>interaction</b> between the two languages.</i>
<b>interactive</b>	Used especially of drugs or muscles that work together so the total effect is greater than the sum of the two (or more). <i>A fully <b>interactive</b> map of the area.</i>
<b>liberalist</b>	A person who favors a political philosophy of progress and reform and the protection of civil liberties.
<b>mutual</b>	A mutual building society or insurance company. <i>My father hated him from the start and the feeling was <b>mutual</b>.</i>

- observance** The act of noticing or paying attention.  
*He drew up a body of monastic **observances**.*
- political** Relating to the ideas or strategies of a particular party or group in politics.  
*Calling a meeting is a **political** act in itself.*
- presidential** Having a bearing or demeanour befitting a president; dignified and confident.  
*He is a very strong leader very **presidential** in his performance.*
- reciprocal** Mathematics one of a pair of numbers whose product is 1 the reciprocal of  $\frac{2}{3}$  is  $\frac{3}{2}$  the multiplicative inverse of 7 is  $\frac{1}{7}$ .  
*The **reciprocal** ratio of  $a$  to  $b$  is  $\frac{b}{a}$ .*
- social** An informal social gathering especially one organized by the members of a particular club or group.  
*The **social** structure of Europe had become more fluid.*
- uniformity** A condition in which everything is regular and unvarying.  
*An attempt to impose administrative and cultural **uniformity**.*
