- *A person with a personality disorder manifesting itself in extreme antisocial attitudes and behaviour.*
- *Someone with a sociopathic personality; a person with an antisocial personality disorder (‘psychopath’ was once widely used but has now been superseded by ‘sociopath’).*

lunatic	An insane person. <i>This lunatic just accelerated out from the side of the road.</i>
madman	An extremely foolish or reckless person. <i>Car got out of control some madman going too fast.</i>
madwoman	A woman lunatic. <i>She d driven my father s convertible like a madwoman.</i>
maniac	A person exhibiting extremely wild or violent behaviour. <i>A religious maniac.</i>

psychotic A person suffering from a psychosis.

antisocial	Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder. <i>Children s antisocial behaviour.</i>
behaviour	The aggregate of the responses or reactions or movements made by an organism in any situation. <i>Management is a set of techniques and behaviours for getting things done.</i>
deranged	Driven insane. <i>A deranged gunman.</i>
diatribe	Thunderous verbal attack. <i>A diatribe against consumerism.</i>
disaffected	Dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control. <i>A military plot by disaffected elements in the army.</i>
disapproval	The expression of disapproval. <i>Jill replied with a hint of disapproval in her voice.</i>
disturbed	Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief. <i>Disturbed grass showed where the horse had passed.</i>
enmity	A state or feeling of active opposition or hostility. <i>Decades of enmity between the two countries.</i>
exhibitionist	A person who behaves in an extravagant way in order to attract attention. <i>I am something of an exhibitionist.</i>
ferocious	Very great; extreme. <i>A ferocious battle.</i>
ferocity	The property of being wild or turbulent. <i>The ferocity of the storm caught them by surprise.</i>
furious	Full of anger or energy; violent or intense. <i>Furious winds.</i>

hostile	Of or belonging to a military enemy. <i>The platoon ran into a pack of hostiles.</i>
illness	Impairment of normal physiological function affecting part or all of an organism. <i>I've never missed a day's work through illness.</i>
incongruous	Lacking in harmony or compatibility or appropriateness. <i>Incongruous behavior.</i>
insane	Afflicted with or characteristic of mental derangement. <i>The peanut butter chocolate is insane.</i>
mentally	In your mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and mentally exhausted.</i>
narcissist	A person who has an excessive interest in or admiration of themselves. <i>Narcissists preening themselves in front of the mirror.</i>
psychopath	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground psychopaths will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
rampage	Violently angry and destructive behavior. <i>Several thousand demonstrators rampaged through the city.</i>
reckless	Marked by defiant disregard for danger or consequences. <i>Reckless squandering of public funds.</i>
reclusive	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>He led a reclusive life.</i>
scarred	Deeply affected or marked by mental or physical pain or injury. <i>Could her scarred mind ever be free of fear.</i>
selfishness	Stinginess resulting from a concern for your own welfare and a disregard of others. <i>An act of pure selfishness.</i>
tempestuous	(of the elements) as if showing violent anger. <i>A tempestuous wind.</i>
unfriendly	Very unfavorable to life or growth. <i>The unfriendly environment at high altitudes.</i>
unsocial	Not seeking or given to association; being or living without companions. <i>The unsocial behaviour of young teenagers.</i>
violent	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>Violent dislike.</i>
