<b>antisocial</b>	Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder. <i>Children s <b>antisocial</b> behaviour.</i>
<b>behaviour</b>	The aggregate of the responses or reactions or movements made by an organism in any situation. <i>Management is a set of techniques and <b>behaviours</b> for getting things done.</i>
<b>deranged</b>	Driven insane. <i>A <b>deranged</b> gunman.</i>
<b>diatribe</b>	Thunderous verbal attack. <i>A <b>diatribe</b> against consumerism.</i>
<b>disaffected</b>	Dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control. <i>A military plot by <b>disaffected</b> elements in the army.</i>
<b>disapproval</b>	The expression of disapproval. <i>Jill replied with a hint of <b>disapproval</b> in her voice.</i>
<b>disturbed</b>	Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief. <i><b>Disturbed</b> grass showed where the horse had passed.</i>
<b>enmity</b>	A state or feeling of active opposition or hostility. <i>Decades of <b>enmity</b> between the two countries.</i>
<b>exhibitionist</b>	A person who behaves in an extravagant way in order to attract attention. <i>I am something of an <b>exhibitionist</b>.</i>
<b>ferocious</b>	Very great; extreme. <i>A <b>ferocious</b> battle.</i>
<b>ferocity</b>	The property of being wild or turbulent. <i>The <b>ferocity</b> of the storm caught them by surprise.</i>
<b>furious</b>	Full of anger or energy; violent or intense. <i><b>Furious</b> winds.</i>

<b><u>hostile</u></b>	Of or belonging to a military enemy. <i>The platoon ran into a pack of <b>hostiles</b>.</i>
<b><u>illness</u></b>	Impairment of normal physiological function affecting part or all of an organism. <i>I've never missed a day's work through <b>illness</b>.</i>
<b><u>incongruous</u></b>	Lacking in harmony or compatibility or appropriateness. <i><b>Incongruous</b> behavior.</i>
<b><u>insane</u></b>	Afflicted with or characteristic of mental derangement. <i>The peanut butter chocolate is <b>insane</b>.</i>
<b>mentally</b>	In your mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and <b>mentally</b> exhausted.</i>
<b>narcissist</b>	A person who has an excessive interest in or admiration of themselves. <i><b>Narcissists</b> preening themselves in front of the mirror.</i>
<b><u>psychopath</u></b>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground <b>psychopaths</b> will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
<b><u>rampage</u></b>	Violently angry and destructive behavior. <i>Several thousand demonstrators <b>rampaged</b> through the city.</i>
<b><u>reckless</u></b>	Marked by defiant disregard for danger or consequences. <i><b>Reckless</b> squandering of public funds.</i>
<b><u>reclusive</u></b>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>He led a <b>reclusive</b> life.</i>
<b><u>scarred</u></b>	Deeply affected or marked by mental or physical pain or injury. <i>Could her <b>scarred</b> mind ever be free of fear.</i>
<b>selfishness</b>	Stinginess resulting from a concern for your own welfare and a disregard of others. <i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
<b>tempestuous</b>	(of the elements) as if showing violent anger. <i>A <b>tempestuous</b> wind.</i>
<b><u>unfriendly</u></b>	Very unfavorable to life or growth. <i>The <b>unfriendly</b> environment at high altitudes.</i>
<b>unsocial</b>	Not seeking or given to association; being or living without companions. <i>The <b>unsocial</b> behaviour of young teenagers.</i>
<b>violent</b>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i><b>Violent</b> dislike.</i>
