- In a smooth and gradual manner.
- With little weight or force.
- Used as a direction in music; to be played relatively softly.
- With low volume.
- In a careful and gentle manner.

With indifference or without dejection.

piano Used as a direction in music; to be played relatively softly.



quietly With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. Her hands rested **quietly** in her lap.

- Speak softly but carry a big stick.
- He whispered softly in my ear.

muted (of colour or lighting) not bright; subdued.

Muted anger.

noiseless Silent or very quiet.

The cycle is a **noiseless** form of transport.

Relating to the Pacific Ocean.

The result of this **pacific** policy was that no troops were called up.

A treaty agreeing peace between warring states.

Peace came on November 11th.

Marked by a state of tranguil repose.

quiescent Strikes were headed by groups of workers who had previously been

quiescent.

Become quiet or quieter.

The street was quiet.

sibilant A sibilant speech sound.

His **sibilant** whisper.

silent Implied by or inferred from actions or statements.

Gave **silent** consent.

(chiefly of aircraft) designed in accordance with technology which makes

stealth detection by radar or sonar difficult.

Privatization by **stealth**.

stillness Tranquil silence.

Absolute **stillness** greeted our gaze.

Quieted and brought under control.

subdued

I felt strangely subdued as I drove home.



Not agitated; without losing self-possession.

The sea was **tranquil**.

tranquility An untroubled state; free from disturbances.

tranquilize Make calm or still.

whisper

A soft or confidential tone of voice a whispered word or phrase.

Alison was **whisper**ing in his ear.
