# Associations of "Soiled" (30 Words)

accumulated	Periodically accumulated over time.
adobe	The clay from which adobe bricks are made. <b>Adobe</b> houses.
bedrock	Solid unweathered rock lying beneath surface deposits of soil. Honesty is the <b>bedrock</b> of a good relationship.
compost	Make vegetable matter or manure into compost. <i>Compost organic debris.</i>
deposition	The natural process of laying down a deposit of something. <i>Pebbles formed by the <b>deposition</b> of calcium in solution.</i>
desertification	The process by which fertile land becomes desert, typically as a result of drought, deforestation, or inappropriate agriculture. The dust storms in Korea are the result of rapid <b>desertification</b> in China.



erode	Gradually destroy or be gradually destroyed. Soft sedimentary rocks have <b>erode</b> d away.
erosion	Erosion by chemical action. <i>After the accounting scandal there was an</i> <b>erosion</b> of confidence in the <i>auditors.</i>
fertilization	Making fertile as by applying fertilizer or manure.
fluvial	Of or found in a river. <i>Fluvial</i> deposits.
<u>gradually</u>	In a gradual manner. The snake moved <b>gradually</b> toward its victim.
<u>hill</u>	Form into a hill. A <b>hill</b> of ruffs looked at from a distance on a sunny day was a very pleasing spectacle.
hummock	A piece of forested ground rising above a marsh.
humus	The organic component of soil, formed by the decomposition of leaves and other plant material by soil microorganisms.
<u>layer</u>	Arrange in a layer or layers. They can be increased from cuttings and <b>layer</b> s.
loam	A rich soil consisting of a mixture of sand and clay and decaying organic materials.
manure	Apply manure to land. The ground should be well dug and <b>manure</b> d.
mound	A large pile or quantity of something. They built small <b>mound</b> s to hide behind.
mud	Soil with mud muck or mire. The two sides took over the local media to throw <b>mud</b> at each other.
peat	A cut piece of peat. He reached forward to add a couple of <b>peat</b> s to the fire.
pleistocene	From two million to 11 thousand years ago; extensive glaciation of the northern hemisphere; the time of human evolution.
quicksand	A treacherous situation that tends to entrap and destroy. John found himself sinking fast in financial <b>quicksand</b> .
riverbank	The bank of a river.
riverbed	The bed or channel in which a river flows.
sandy	Resembling or containing or abounding in sand or growing in sandy areas. Pale eyes and receding <b>sandy</b> hair.



sediment	Deposit as a sediment. The DNA was <b>sediment</b> ed by centrifugation.
sedimentation	The process of settling or being deposited as a sediment. <b>Sedimentation</b> occurs when the droplets sink to the bottom.
silt	Become filled or blocked with silt. The soil ends up <b>silt</b> ing up the stream.
sludge	The precipitate produced by sewage treatment. Miscellaneous chemicals and treated <b>sludge</b> s.
topsoil	The top layer of soil. Keep all the <b>topsoil</b> you remove you re bound to find a use for it later.
