## Associations of "Sold" (30 Words)

<b>advertiser</b>	A person or company that advertises a product, service, or event. <i>Kids hate it when <b>advertisers</b> try too hard to target them on their level.</i>
<b>auction</b>	Sell or offer for sale at an auction. <i>The painting was <b>auctioned</b> at Christie s.</i>
<b>automat</b>	A cafeteria in which food and drink were obtained from slot machines.
<b>business</b>	Business concerns collectively. <i>Government and <b>business</b> could not agree.</i>
<b>coupon</b>	Of a consumer collect and use coupons or vouchers offering discounts on goods or services. <i>He had a big beaming smile on his <b>coupon</b>.</i>
<b>deal</b>	The set of hands dealt to the players. <i>I can <b>deal</b> with this crew of workers.</i>
<b>huckster</b>	A person who writes radio or tv advertisements. <i>He was <b>huckstering</b> a video.</i>
<a href="#">market</a>	The securities markets in the aggregate. <i>They wanted to browse around the street <b>market</b>.</i>
<b>marketable</b>	Being in demand by especially employers. <i><b>Marketable</b> produce.</i>
<b>marketer</b>	A person or company that advertises or promotes something. <i>A leading manufacturer and <b>marketer</b> of medical products.</i>
<b>merchandise</b>	Engage in the business of a merchant. <i>Good business depends on having good <b>merchandise</b>.</i>
<b>merchandising</b>	The activity of promoting the sale of goods, especially by their presentation in retail outlets. <i>Problems rooted in poor <b>merchandising</b>.</i>
<a href="#">merchant</a>	In historical contexts relating to merchants or commerce. <i>A <b>merchant</b> seaman.</i>

<b>outsell</b>	Sell or be sold in greater quantities than. <i>The new Toyota <b>outsells</b> the Honda by a wide margin.</i>
<b>peddle</b>	Promote (an idea or view) persistently or widely. <i>He was arrested after trying to <b>peddle</b> guns.</i>
<b>price</b>	Discover or establish the price of something for sale. <i>The cattle thief has a <b>price</b> on his head.</i>
<b>purchaser</b>	A person who buys. <i>One of the club's prospective <b>purchasers</b>.</i>
<b>salesclerk</b>	A salesperson in a store.
<b><u>salesman</u></b>	A man whose job involves selling or promoting commercial products, either in a shop or visiting locations to get orders. <i>An insurance <b>salesman</b>.</i>
<b>salesperson</b>	A person employed to represent a business and to sell its merchandise (as to customers in a store or to customers who are visited).
<b><u>seller</u></b>	Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money. <i>The book became the biggest <b>seller</b> in the history of royal publishing.</i>
<b>shopper</b>	A small-wheeled bicycle with a basket, designed for use while shopping. <i>A commercial centre thronged with <b>shoppers</b>.</i>
<b>stall</b>	Cause to stall. <i>His career had <b>stalled</b> hers taken off.</i>
<b><u>store</u></b>	A shop of any size or kind. <i>DIY <b>stores</b>.</i>
<b><u>trade</u></b>	Engage in the trade of. <i>He's a carpenter by <b>trade</b>.</i>
<b>undersell</b>	Sell cheaper than one's competition. <i>She feels she was <b>underselling</b> herself by putting her disability high on her CV.</i>
<b>vend</b>	Offer (small items) for sale, either from a stall or from a slot machine. <i>The company makes and <b>vends</b> environmentally friendly beauty products.</i>
<b><u>vendor</u></b>	The seller in a sale, especially of property. <i>An Italian ice cream <b>vendor</b>.</i>
<b>vintner</b>	Someone who makes wine.
<b>wholesale</b>	At a wholesale price. <i>The manufacturer's <b>wholesale</b> price.</i>
