Associations of "Sold" (30 Words)

advertiser	A person or company that advertises a product, service, or event. <i>Kids hate it when advertisers try too hard to target them on their level.</i>
auction	Sell or offer for sale at an auction. <i>The painting was auctioned at Christie s.</i>
automat	A cafeteria in which food and drink were obtained from slot machines.
business	Business concerns collectively. <i>Government and business could not agree.</i>
coupon	Of a consumer collect and use coupons or vouchers offering discounts on goods or services. <i>He had a big beaming smile on his coupon.</i>
deal	The set of hands dealt to the players. <i>I can deal with this crew of workers.</i>
huckster	A person who writes radio or tv advertisements. <i>He was huckstering a video.</i>
market	The securities markets in the aggregate. <i>They wanted to browse around the street market.</i>
marketable	Being in demand by especially employers. <i>Marketable produce.</i>
marketer	A person or company that advertises or promotes something. <i>A leading manufacturer and marketer of medical products.</i>
merchandise	Engage in the business of a merchant. <i>Good business depends on having good merchandise.</i>
merchandising	The activity of promoting the sale of goods, especially by their presentation in retail outlets. <i>Problems rooted in poor merchandising.</i>
merchant	In historical contexts relating to merchants or commerce. <i>A merchant seaman.</i>

outsell	Sell or be sold in greater quantities than. <i>The new Toyota outsells the Honda by a wide margin.</i>
peddle	Promote (an idea or view) persistently or widely. <i>He was arrested after trying to peddle guns.</i>
price	Discover or establish the price of something for sale. <i>The cattle thief has a price on his head.</i>
purchaser	A person who buys. <i>One of the club's prospective purchasers.</i>
salesclerk	A salesperson in a store.
<u>salesman</u>	A man whose job involves selling or promoting commercial products, either in a shop or visiting locations to get orders. <i>An insurance salesman.</i>
salesperson	A person employed to represent a business and to sell its merchandise (as to customers in a store or to customers who are visited).
<u>seller</u>	Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money. <i>The book became the biggest seller in the history of royal publishing.</i>
shopper	A small-wheeled bicycle with a basket, designed for use while shopping. <i>A commercial centre thronged with shoppers.</i>
stall	Cause to stall. <i>His career had stalled hers taken off.</i>
<u>store</u>	A shop of any size or kind. <i>DIY stores.</i>
<u>trade</u>	Engage in the trade of. <i>He is a carpenter by trade.</i>
undersell	Sell cheaper than one's competition. <i>She feels she was underselling herself by putting her disability high on her CV.</i>
vend	Offer (small items) for sale, either from a stall or from a slot machine. <i>The company makes and vends environmentally friendly beauty products.</i>
<u>vendor</u>	The seller in a sale, especially of property. <i>An Italian ice cream vendor.</i>
vintner	Someone who makes wine.
wholesale	At a wholesale price. <i>The manufacturer's wholesale price.</i>
