<b>persevere</b>	Continue in a course of action even in the face of difficulty or with little or no indication of success. <i>His family <b>persevered</b> with his treatment.</i>
<b><u><a href="#">persist</a></u></b>	Be persistent refuse to stop. <i>If the symptoms <b>persist</b> for more than a few days then contact your doctor.</i>
<b>plod on</b>	Walk heavily and firmly, as when weary, or through mud.
<b>plough on</b>	Continue moving forward.
<b>press ahead</b>	Create by pressing.
<b>press on</b>	Exert pressure or force to or upon.
<b>see something through</b>	Go to see for a social visit.
<b>show determination</b>	Provide evidence for.
<b>stand fast</b>	Have or maintain a position or stand on an issue.
<b>stand firm</b>	Be tall; have a height of; copula.
<b>stand one's ground</b>	Put up with something or somebody unpleasant.

Continue in a place, position, or situation.

**struggle on**

To exert strenuous effort against opposition.

<b>defend</b>	Compete to retain (a title or seat) in a contest or election. <i>Ms Smith will represent the <b>defendant</b>.</i>
<b>defense</b>	The act of defending someone or something against attack or injury. <i>In <b>defense</b> he said the other man started it.</i>
<b>fighting</b>	The act of fighting any contest or struggle. <i>He put up his fists and took a <b>fighting</b> stance.</i>
<b>flotilla</b>	A United States Navy fleet consisting of two or more squadrons of small warships. <i>A <b>flotilla</b> of cargo boats.</i>
<b>fort</b>	A fortified building or strategic position. <i>The city was guarded by a ring of <b>forts</b>.</i>
<b>fortress</b>	A fortified defensive structure. <i>He had proved himself to be a <b>fortress</b> of moral rectitude.</i>
<b>garrison</b>	Station troops in a fort or garrison. <i>The entire <b>garrison</b> was mustered on the parade ground.</i>
<b>guardian</b>	The superior of a Franciscan convent. <i>I am acting as <b>guardian</b> of my late brother s family.</i>
<b>knight</b>	A chess piece typically with its top shaped like a horse s head that moves by jumping to the opposite corner of a rectangle two squares by three Each player starts the game with two knights. <i>In all your quarrels I will be your <b>knight</b>.</i>
<b>legionary</b>	A soldier who is a member of a legion (especially the French Foreign Legion). <i>The <b>legionary</b> fortress of Isca.</i>
<b>military</b>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>He organized his shows with <b>military</b> precision.</i>
<b>naval</b>	Connected with or belonging to or used in a navy. <i>A <b>naval</b> officer.</i>
<b>outpost</b>	A small military camp or position at some distance from the main army, used especially as a guard against surprise attack. <i>A few scattered <b>outposts</b> along the west coast.</i>
<b>protector</b>	A regent in charge of a kingdom during the minority, absence, or incapacity of the sovereign. <i>Ear <b>protectors</b>.</i>

<b><u>siege</u></b>	A military operation in which enemy forces surround a town or building, cutting off essential supplies, with the aim of compelling those inside to surrender. <i>Verdun had withstood a <b>siege</b> of ten weeks.</i>
<b>stockade</b>	An enclosure bound by a stockade. <i>He surrendered two weeks after escaping the <b>stockade</b> at the air force base.</i>
<b>submarine</b>	Attack by submarine. <i>The child was injured when he <b>submarined</b> under the safety belt of the car.</i>
<b><u>territorial</u></b>	A territorial military unit. <i>Strongly <b>territorial</b> birds.</i>
<b><u>warfare</u></b>	An active struggle between competing entities. <i>Guerrilla <b>warfare</b>.</i>
<b><u>warrior</u></b>	Someone engaged in or experienced in warfare. <i>I really love the <b>warrior</b> pose it makes me feel centred and strong.</i>
<b>warship</b>	A ship equipped with weapons and designed to take part in warfare at sea.
