stand fast	Have or maintain a position or stand on an issue.
stand firm	Be tall; have a height of; copula.
stand one's ground	Put up with something or somebody unpleasant.

Stop or halt.

Continue in a place, position, or situation.

struggle on

To exert strenuous effort against opposition.

flotilla	A United States Navy fleet consisting of two or more squadrons of small warships. <i>A flotilla of cargo boats.</i>
fort	A fortified building or strategic position. <i>The city was guarded by a ring of forts.</i>
fortress	A fortified defensive structure. <i>He had proved himself to be a fortress of moral rectitude.</i>
garrison	Station troops in a fort or garrison. <i>The entire garrison was mustered on the parade ground.</i>
guardian	The superior of a Franciscan convent. <i>I am acting as guardian of my late brother s family.</i>
knight	A chess piece typically with its top shaped like a horse s head that moves by jumping to the opposite corner of a rectangle two squares by three Each player starts the game with two knights. <i>In all your quarrels I will be your knight.</i>
legionary	A soldier who is a member of a legion (especially the French Foreign Legion). <i>The legionary fortress of Isca.</i>
military	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>He organized his shows with military precision.</i>
naval	Connected with or belonging to or used in a navy. <i>A naval officer.</i>
outpost	A small military camp or position at some distance from the main army, used especially as a guard against surprise attack. <i>A few scattered outposts along the west coast.</i>
protector	A regent in charge of a kingdom during the minority, absence, or incapacity of the sovereign. <i>Ear protectors.</i>

<u>siege</u>	A military operation in which enemy forces surround a town or building, cutting off essential supplies, with the aim of compelling those inside to surrender. <i>Verdun had withstood a siege of ten weeks.</i>
stockade	An enclosure bound by a stockade. <i>He surrendered two weeks after escaping the stockade at the air force base.</i>
submarine	Attack by submarine. <i>The child was injured when he submarined under the safety belt of the car.</i>
<u>territorial</u>	A territorial military unit. <i>Strongly territorial birds.</i>
<u>warfare</u>	An active struggle between competing entities. <i>Guerrilla warfare.</i>
<u>warrior</u>	Someone engaged in or experienced in warfare. <i>I really love the warrior pose it makes me feel centred and strong.</i>
warship	A ship equipped with weapons and designed to take part in warfare at sea.
