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## Associations of "Soldiers" (30 Words)

<b>armor</b>	Equip with armor.
<b>army</b>	The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare. <i>He joined the <b>army</b> at 16.</i>
<b>bastion</b>	A natural rock formation resembling a man made bastion. <i>A <b>bastion</b> against corruption.</i>
<b>bomber</b>	A bomber jacket. <i>Manny hand rolled a couple of <b>bombers</b>.</i>
<b>brigade</b>	Form into a brigade. <i>They thought the speech too closely <b>brigaded</b> with illegal action.</i>
<b>cantonment</b>	A permanent military station in British India.
<b>castle</b>	Move (the king) by castling. <i>The crumbling stonework of a ruined <b>castle</b>.</i>
<b>centurion</b>	The leader of 100 soldiers.
<b>commander</b>	A commissioned naval officer who ranks above a lieutenant commander and below a captain. <i>The <b>commander</b> of a paratroop regiment.</i>
<b>defend</b>	Be on the defensive; act against an attack. <i>They were forced to <b>defend</b> for long periods.</i>
<b>defense</b>	The team that is trying to prevent the other team from scoring. <i>Sanitation is the best <b>defense</b> against disease.</i>
<b>fighting</b>	The action of fighting violence or conflict. <i>He put up his fists and took a <b>fighting</b> stance.</i>
<b>flotilla</b>	A United States Navy fleet consisting of two or more squadrons of small warships. <i>A <b>flotilla</b> of cargo boats.</i>

<b><u>fort</u></b>	A fortified building or strategic position. <i>The city was guarded by a ring of <b>forts</b>.</i>
<b><u>fortress</u></b>	A fortified defensive structure. <i>He had proved himself to be a <b>fortress</b> of moral rectitude.</i>
<b><u>garrison</u></b>	The building occupied by a garrison. <i>Forces from these <b>garrisons</b> have been used against governments.</i>
<b><u>guardian</u></b>	A person who protects or defends something. <i>Self appointed <b>guardians</b> of public morality.</i>
<b><u>knight</u></b>	A chess piece typically with its top shaped like a horse's head that moves by jumping to the opposite corner of a rectangle two squares by three. Each player starts the game with two knights. <i>In all your quarrels I will be your <b>knight</b>.</i>
<b><u>legionary</u></b>	A soldier who is a member of a legion (especially the French Foreign Legion). <i>The <b>legionary</b> fortress of Isca.</i>
<b><u>military</u></b>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>The build up of <b>military</b> activity.</i>
<b><u>naval</u></b>	Relating to a navy or navies. <i>A <b>naval</b> officer.</i>
<b><u>outpost</u></b>	A military post stationed at a distance from the main body of troops. <i>The community is the last <b>outpost</b> of civilization in the far north.</i>
<b><u>protector</u></b>	A regent in charge of a kingdom during the minority, absence, or incapacity of the sovereign. <i>Ear <b>protectors</b>.</i>
<b><u>siege</u></b>	The action of an armed force that surrounds a fortified place and isolates it while continuing to attack. <i>Two cult members have died so far in the four day <b>siege</b>.</i>
<b><u>stockade</u></b>	Enclose an area by erecting a stockade. <i>We got ashore and into the <b>stockade</b>.</i>
<b><u>submarine</u></b>	Attack by submarine. <i>The Germans <b>submarined</b> the Allies.</i>
<b><u>territorial</u></b>	Displaying territoriality defending a territory from intruders. <i>These sharks are aggressively <b>territorial</b>.</i>
<b><u>warfare</u></b>	An active struggle between competing entities. <i>Diplomatic <b>warfare</b>.</i>
<b><u>warrior</u></b>	Any of a number of standing poses in yoga in which the legs are held apart and the arms are stretched outwards. <i>I really love the <b>warrior</b> pose it makes me feel centred and strong.</i>

**warship** A ship equipped with weapons and designed to take part in warfare at sea.
