## **Solicitation as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Solicitation" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “solicitation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An entreaty addressed to someone of superior status.*
- *The act of asking for or trying to obtain something from someone.*
- *The act of accosting someone and offering one's or someone else's services as a prostitute.*
- *Request for a sum of money.*
- *The act of enticing a person to do something wrong (as an offer of sex in return for money).*



## Synonyms of "Solicitation" as a noun (4 Words)

- allurement** Attractiveness.  
*Its **allurement** was its remoteness.*
- appeal** Request for a sum of money.  
*His mother made an **appeal** for the return of the ring.*
- collection** A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection.  
*A **collection** of essays.*
- ingathering** Request for a sum of money.



## Usage Examples of "Solicitation" as a noun

- *He was a regular target for solicitation of funds.*
- *A solicitation to the king for relief.*
- *A woman arrested for solicitation.*
- *People objected to receiving telephone solicitations.*





## Associations of "Solicitation" (30 Words)

<b>appeal</b>	Take a court case to a higher court for review. <i>A look of <b>appeal</b> on his face.</i>
<b>asking</b>	The verbal act of requesting.
<b>beg</b>	Acquire food or money from someone by begging. <i>He <b>begged</b> his fellow passengers for help.</i>
<b>beseech</b>	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>They <b>beseech</b>ed him to stay.</i>
<b>cadge</b>	Ask for and get free; be a parasite. <i>He <b>cadged</b> fivers off old school friends.</i>

<b>conjure</b>	Implore (someone) to do something. <i>Anne <b>conjured</b> up a delicious home made hotpot.</i>
<b>crave</b>	Feel a powerful desire for (something). <i>If only she had shown her daughter the love she <b>craved</b>.</i>
<b>desperately</b>	In a way that shows despair. <i>The soil <b>desperately</b> needed potash.</i>
<b>entreat</b>	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>His friends <b>entreated</b> him not to go.</i>
<b>entreaty</b>	An earnest or humble request. <i>An <b>entreaty</b> to stop the fighting.</i>
<b>exhortation</b>	An address or communication emphatically urging someone to do something. <i><b>Exhortations</b> to consumers to switch off electrical appliances.</i>
<b>implore</b>	Beg earnestly for. <i>I <b>implore</b> mercy.</i>
<b>invitation</b>	A written or verbal request inviting someone to go somewhere or to do something. <i>A herb garden where guests can only go at the <b>invitation</b> of the chef.</i>
<b>invite</b>	Invite someone to one's house. <i>Applications are <b>invited</b> for the post of Director.</i>
<b>invocation</b>	An incantation used to invoke a deity or the supernatural. <i>His <b>invocation</b> of the ancient powers of Callanish.</i>
<b>necessary</b>	Absolutely essential. <i>The <b>necessary</b> consequences of one's actions.</i>
<b>perforce</b>	Used to express necessity or inevitability. <i>Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<b>petition</b>	Reverent petition to a deity. <i>The organization is <b>petitioning</b> the EU for a moratorium on the patent.</i>
<b>plea</b>	A formal statement by or on behalf of a defendant or prisoner, stating guilt or innocence in response to a charge, offering an allegation of fact, or claiming that a point of law should apply. <i>He changed his <b>plea</b> to not guilty.</i>
<b>plead</b>	Make an allegation in an action or other legal proceeding especially answer the previous pleading of the other party by denying facts therein stated or by alleging new facts. <i>The youth <b>pleaded</b> guilty to murdering the girl.</i>
<b>please</b>	It is someone's choice to do something. <i>Would you like a drink Yes <b>please</b>.</i>

<b>pray</b>	Address a prayer to God or another deity. <i>And what <b>pray</b> was the purpose of that.</i>
<b>prayer</b>	Earnest or urgent request. <i>The priest sank to his knees in <b>prayer</b>.</i>
<b>request</b>	A tune or song played on a radio programme typically accompanied by a personal message in response to a listener's request. <i>The chairman <b>requested</b> that the reports be considered.</i>
<b>solicit</b>	Make a solicitation or entreaty for something request urgently or persistently. <i>Historians and critics are <b>solicited</b> for opinions by the auction houses.</i>
<b>suppliant</b>	Humbly entreating. <i>A <b>suppliant</b> sinner seeking forgiveness.</i>
<b>supplicant</b>	A person making a humble or earnest plea to someone in power or authority. <i>We are equals and not <b>supplicants</b> begging for work.</i>
<b>supplicate</b>	Ask or beg for something earnestly or humbly. <i><b>Supplicate</b> God's blessing.</i>
<b>supplication</b>	A humble request for help from someone in authority. <i>He fell to his knees in <b>supplication</b>.</i>
<b>woo</b>	Seek someone's favor. <i>China is <b>wooing</b> Russia.</i>
