- *Become solid.*
- *Make or become hard or solid.*
- *Make solid or more solid; cause to solidify.*
- *Make stronger; reinforce.*



Synonyms of "Solidify" as a verb (20 Words)

bake	Be very hot, due to hot weather or exposure to the sun. <i>The soil in the desert is baked dry by the fierce heat of the sun.</i>
cake	Form a coat over. <i>His clothes were caked in mud.</i>
clot	Form or cause to form clots. <i>Blood clots.</i>
coagulate	Cause (a fluid) to change to a solid or semi-solid state. <i>Adrenaline coagulates the blood.</i>
<u>congeal</u>	Become gelatinous. <i>The ballet failed to congeal as a single oeuvre.</i>
<u>consolidate</u>	Bring together into a single whole or system. <i>All manufacturing activities have been consolidated in new premises.</i>
curdle	Turn into curds. <i>Take care not to let the soup boil or it will curdle.</i>

dry	Remove the moisture from and make dry. <i>The launddry dries in the sun.</i>
fossilize	Become mentally inflexible. <i>The little animals fossilized and are now embedded in the limestone.</i>
freeze	Cause to freeze. <i>She came out with a revolver and told the boys to freeze.</i>
gel	Form into a gel. <i>Short gelled hair.</i>
go hard	Give support (to) or make a choice (of) one out of a group or number.
harden	Harden by reheating and cooling in oil. <i>Wait for the glue to harden.</i>
ice over	Put ice on or put on ice.
ice up	Cause to become ice or icy.
ossify	Become rigid or fixed in attitude or position; cease developing. <i>These tracheal cartilages may ossify.</i>
petrify	Change into stone. <i>Slogans petrify our thinking.</i>
set	Put or set seeds seedlings or plants into the ground. <i>The Home Secretary set in motion a review of the law.</i>
stiffen	Make stiff or stiffer. <i>He stiffened when he saw his boss enter the room.</i>
thicken	Make viscous or dense. <i>The sauce thickened.</i>



Usage Examples of "Solidify" as a verb

- *Social and political pressures helped to solidify national identities.*
- *The magma slowly solidifies and forms crystals.*

amalgamate	Joined together into a whole. <i>The amalgamated colleges constituted a university.</i>
<u>annex</u>	Take (territory) as if by conquest. <i>The school s one storey wooden annex.</i>
chill	Chilly. <i>A chill ran down my spine.</i>
<u>coalesce</u>	Mix together different elements. <i>The puddles had coalesced into shallow streams.</i>
coalescing	Growing together, fusing.
coeducation	Education of men and women in the same institutions.
cold	Having a low or inadequate temperature or feeling a sensation of coldness or having been made cold by e g ice or refrigeration. <i>Elise was cold and barren.</i>

combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>An ideal place to combine shopping and sightseeing.</i>
commingle	Mix; blend. <i>The part of the brain where the senses commingle.</i>
compression	Encoding information while reducing the bandwidth or bits required.
condense	Cause a gas or vapor to change into a liquid. <i>He condensed the three plays into a three hour drama.</i>
consolidate	Strengthen (one's position or power). <i>Consolidate fibers into boards.</i>
consolidation	The act of combining into an integral whole. <i>A consolidation of two corporations.</i>
converge	Move or draw together at a certain location. <i>Half a million sports fans will converge on the capital for the London Marathon.</i>
crystallize	Assume crystalline form become crystallized. <i>Crystallize minerals.</i>
federate	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>Federate armies.</i>
freeze	Stop a process or a habit by imposing a freeze on it. <i>Water freezes at 32 degrees Fahrenheit.</i>
ice	Put ice on or put on ice. <i>Look at the ice on that dame.</i>
incorporation	The inclusion of something as part of a whole. <i>The City Council opposed all new incorporations.</i>
integrate	Become one become integrated. <i>The protest forced the bus companies to integrate the buses.</i>
integration	The coordination of processes in the nervous system, including diverse sensory information and motor impulses. <i>Economic and political integration.</i>
meld	A thing formed by melding a combination. <i>Australia s winemakers have melded modern science with traditional art.</i>
merge	Combine or cause to combine to form a single entity. <i>He placed a sheet of paper over the fresh paint to merge the colours.</i>
molten	(especially of materials with a high melting point, such as metal and glass) liquefied by heat. <i>A mass of molten rock.</i>

refrigerant	Causing cooling or freezing. <i>A refrigerant substance such as ice or solid carbon dioxide.</i>
reunify	Restore political unity to (a place or group, especially a divided territory). <i>Will Korea reunify.</i>
<u>unify</u>	To bring or combine together or with something else. <i>Opposition groups struggling to unify around the goal of replacing the regime.</i>
unite	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>She unites charm with a good business sense.</i>
<u>united</u>	Of or relating to two people who are married to each other. <i>Women acting together in a united way.</i>
weld	Forge an article by welding. <i>Her gratitude welded her to him.</i>
