## Solidify as a Verb

### Definitions of "Solidify" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “solidify” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Become solid.*
- *Make or become hard or solid.*
- *Make solid or more solid; cause to solidify.*
- *Make stronger; reinforce.*



## Synonyms of "Solidify" as a verb (20 Words)

- bake** Be very hot, due to hot weather or exposure to the sun.  
*The soil in the desert is **baked** dry by the fierce heat of the sun.*
- cake** Form a coat over.  
*His clothes were **cased** in mud.*
- clot** Form or cause to form clots.  
*Blood **clots**.*
- coagulate** Cause (a fluid) to change to a solid or semi-solid state.  
*Adrenaline **coagulates** the blood.*
- congeal** Become gelatinous.  
*The ballet failed to **congeal** as a single oeuvre.*
- consolidate** Bring together into a single whole or system.  
*All manufacturing activities have been **consolidated** in new premises.*
- curdle** Turn into curds.  
*Take care not to let the soup boil or it will **curdle**.*

<b>dry</b>	Remove the moisture from and make dry. <i>The laundry <b>dries</b> in the sun.</i>
<b>fossilize</b>	Become mentally inflexible. <i>The little animals <b>fossilized</b> and are now embedded in the limestone.</i>
<b>freeze</b>	Cause to freeze. <i>She came out with a revolver and told the boys to <b>freeze</b>.</i>
<b>gel</b>	Form into a gel. <i>Short <b>gelled</b> hair.</i>
<b>go hard</b>	Give support (to) or make a choice (of) one out of a group or number.
<b>harden</b>	Harden by reheating and cooling in oil. <i>Wait for the glue to <b>harden</b>.</i>
<b>ice over</b>	Put ice on or put on ice.
<b>ice up</b>	Cause to become ice or icy.
<b>ossify</b>	Become rigid or fixed in attitude or position; cease developing. <i>These tracheal cartilages may <b>ossify</b>.</i>
<b>petrify</b>	Change into stone. <i>Slogans <b>petrify</b> our thinking.</i>
<b>set</b>	Put or set seeds seedlings or plants into the ground. <i>The Home Secretary <b>set</b> in motion a review of the law.</i>
<b>stiffen</b>	Make stiff or stiffer. <i>He <b>stiffened</b> when he saw his boss enter the room.</i>
<b>thicken</b>	Make viscous or dense. <i>The sauce <b>thickened</b>.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Solidify" as a verb

- *Social and political pressures helped to solidify national identities.*
- *The magma slowly solidifies and forms crystals.*

- annex** Take (territory) as if by conquest.

- chill** Chilly.

- coalesce** Mix together different elements.  
*The puddles had **coalesced** into shallow streams.*
- coalescing** Growing together, fusing.
- coeducation** Education of men and women in the same institutions.
- cold** Having a low or inadequate temperature or feeling a sensation of coldness or having been made cold by e g ice or refrigeration.  
*Elise was **cold** and barren.*

<b>combine</b>	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>An ideal place to <b>combine</b> shopping and sightseeing.</i>
<b>commingle</b>	Mix; blend. <i>The part of the brain where the senses <b>commingle</b>.</i>
<b>compression</b>	Encoding information while reducing the bandwidth or bits required.
<b>condense</b>	Cause a gas or vapor to change into a liquid. <i>He <b>condensed</b> the three plays into a three hour drama.</i>
<b>consolidate</b>	Strengthen (one's position or power). <i><b>Consolidate</b> fibers into boards.</i>
<b>consolidation</b>	The act of combining into an integral whole. <i>A <b>consolidation</b> of two corporations.</i>
<b>converge</b>	Move or draw together at a certain location. <i>Half a million sports fans will <b>converge</b> on the capital for the London Marathon.</i>
<b>crystallize</b>	Assume crystalline form become crystallized. <i><b>Crystallize</b> minerals.</i>
<b>federate</b>	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i><b>Federate</b> armies.</i>
<b>freeze</b>	Stop a process or a habit by imposing a freeze on it. <i>Water <b>freezes</b> at 32 degrees Fahrenheit.</i>
<b>ice</b>	Put ice on or put on ice. <i>Look at the <b>ice</b> on that dame.</i>
<b>incorporation</b>	The inclusion of something as part of a whole. <i>The City Council opposed all new <b>incorporations</b>.</i>
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>The protest forced the bus companies to <b>integrate</b> the buses.</i>
<b>integration</b>	The coordination of processes in the nervous system, including diverse sensory information and motor impulses. <i>Economic and political <b>integration</b>.</i>
<b>meld</b>	A thing formed by melding a combination. <i>Australia s winemakers have <b>melded</b> modern science with traditional art.</i>
<b>merge</b>	Combine or cause to combine to form a single entity. <i>He placed a sheet of paper over the fresh paint to <b>merge</b> the colours.</i>
<b>molten</b>	(especially of materials with a high melting point, such as metal and glass) liquefied by heat. <i>A mass of <b>molten</b> rock.</i>

- refrigerant** Causing cooling or freezing.  
*A **refrigerant** substance such as ice or solid carbon dioxide.*
- reunify** Restore political unity to (a place or group, especially a divided territory).  
*Will Korea **reunify**.*
- unify** To bring or combine together or with something else.  
*Opposition groups struggling to **unify** around the goal of replacing the regime.*
- unite** Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief.  
*She **unites** charm with a good business sense.*
- united** Of or relating to two people who are married to each other.  
*Women acting together in a **united** way.*
- weld** Forge an article by welding.  
*Her gratitude **welded** her to him.*
