Definitions of "Somatic" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “somatic” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Relating to the body, especially as distinct from the mind.*
- *Relating to the soma.*
- *Affecting or characteristic of the body as opposed to the mind or spirit.*



Synonyms of "Somatic" as an adjective (11 Words)

corporal	Possessing or existing in bodily form- Shakespeare. <i>A corporal defect.</i>
<u>corporeal</u>	Relating to a person's body, especially as opposed to their spirit. <i>That which is created is of necessity corporeal and visible and tangible.</i>
human	Having human form or attributes as opposed to those of animals or divine beings. <i>The human body.</i>
material	Having material or physical form or substance. <i>Material living standards have risen.</i>
materialistic	Marked by materialism. <i>We re living in a highly materialistic society.</i>
mortal	Involving loss of divine grace or spiritual death. <i>He was in a mortal hurry.</i>

mundane	Of this earthly world rather than a heavenly or spiritual one. <i>His mundane humdrum existence.</i>
secular	Not concerned with or devoted to religion. <i>Secular attitudes to death.</i>
temporal	Characteristic of or devoted to the temporal world as opposed to the spiritual world. <i>Temporal possessions of the church.</i>
worldly	(of a person) experienced and sophisticated. <i>The benefits of his worldly wisdom.</i>

Usage Examples of "Somatic" as an adjective

- Patients completed a questionnaire about their somatic and psychological symptoms.
- A somatic symptom or somatic illness.

Associations of "Somatic" (30 Words)

adipose	(especially of body tissue) used for the storage of fat. <i>Adipose tissue constitutes the fat of meat.</i>
afferent	An afferent nerve fibre or vessel. <i>Afferent impulses.</i>
byproduct	A secondary and sometimes unexpected consequence.
contents	A list of divisions (chapters or articles) and the pages on which they start. <i>He emptied the contents of his pockets.</i>
corporal	A rank of non commissioned officer in the army above lance corporal or private first class and below sergeant. <i>What seemed corporal melted as breath into the wind.</i>
corporeal	Having material or physical form or substance - Benjamin Jowett. <i>In Scotland goods includes all corporeal movables except money.</i>
drapery	The depiction of folds of cloth in sculpture or painting. <i>The hall of the school was hung with green drapery.</i>
felt	Make into felt mat together. <i>The fibres are shredded and felted together.</i>
filling	The act of filling something. <i>A gold filling.</i>

fitness	Fitness to traverse the seas. <i>If sharp teeth increase fitness then genes causing teeth to be sharp will increase in frequency.</i>
frailty	The condition of being weak and delicate. <i>The increasing frailty of old age.</i>
freon	An aerosol propellant, refrigerant, or organic solvent consisting of one or more of a group of chlorofluorocarbons and related compounds.
<u>gym</u>	Gymnastics. <i>I can t do gym today.</i>
hyperactivity	Constantly active and sometimes disruptive behaviour, occurring primarily in children. <i>Hyperactivity of the thyroid gland.</i>
infirmity	The state of being weak in health or body (especially from old age). <i>Old age and infirmity come to men and women alike.</i>
item	Used to introduce each item in a list. <i>He noticed an item in the New York Times.</i>
lined	Bordered by a line of things. <i>A sheet of lined paper.</i>
material	Having material or physical form or substance Benjamin Jowett. <i>He was university material.</i>
overtax	Require to pay too much tax. <i>The UK is not overtaxed compared to other countries.</i>
packing	The action or process of packing something. <i>Polystyrene packing.</i>
panacea	The goddess of healing; daughter of Aesculapius and sister of Hygeia. <i>The panacea for all corporate ills.</i>
physical	Impelled by physical force especially against resistance. <i>The physical characteristics of the earth.</i>
<u>qualitative</u>	(of an adjective) describing the quality of something in size, appearance, value, etc. Such adjectives can be submodified by words such as very and have comparative and superlative forms. <i>A qualitative change in the undergraduate curriculum.</i>
qualitatively	In a qualitative manner. <i>Security levels can be qualitatively assessed.</i>
stratum	A surface on which an organism grows or is attached. <i>A geological stratum.</i>

textile	Artifact made by weaving or felting or knitting or crocheting natural or synthetic fibers. <i>A fascinating range of pottery jewellery and textiles.</i>
valance	A decorative framework to conceal curtain fixtures at the top of a window casing.
vinyl	A vinyl record. <i>The vinyl is cut to size with a craft knife.</i>
weft	(in weaving) the crosswise threads on a loom that are passed over and under the warp threads to make cloth. <i>Weft threads.</i>
