## Associations of "Somber antonym" (30 Words)

<b>alphabet</b>	The basic elements in a system which combine to form complex entities. <i>DNA s 4 letter <b>alphabet</b>.</i>
<b>blue</b>	Blue clothes or material. <i>The dark <b>blue</b> of his eyes.</i>
<b>cheerless</b>	Gloomy; depressing. <i>Something <b>cheerless</b> about the room.</i>
<b>dejected</b>	Affected or marked by low spirits. <i>He stood in the street looking <b>dejected</b>.</i>
<b>depressed</b>	Lower than previously. <i>A <b>depressed</b> fracture of the skull.</i>
<b>despairing</b>	Arising from or marked by despair or loss of hope. <i>He gave a <b>despairing</b> little shrug.</i>
<b>despondent</b>	Without or almost without hope. <i>She grew more and more <b>despondent</b>.</i>
<b>dictionary</b>	A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words with information about them. <i>The <b>dictionary</b> definition of smile.</i>
<b>dingy</b>	Discolored by impurities; not bright and clear is often used in combination. <i>A dirty or <b>dingy</b> white.</i>
<b>diphthong</b>	A digraph representing the sound of a diphthong or single vowel as in feat.
<b>dismal</b>	Causing a mood of gloom or depression. <i>The <b>dismal</b> weather made the late afternoon seem like evening.</i>
<b>dispirited</b>	Marked by low spirits; showing no enthusiasm. <i>She was determined to appear unworried in front of her <b>dispirited</b> family.</i>
<b>downcast</b>	Filled with melancholy and despondency. <i>You mustn t be <b>downcast</b>.</i>

<b>dreary</b>	Depressingly dull and bleak or repetitive. <i>The <b>dreary</b> round of working eating and trying to sleep.</i>
<b>etymology</b>	The origin of a word and the historical development of its meaning. <i>The decline of <b>etymology</b> as a linguistic discipline.</i>
<b><u>gloomy</u></b>	Filled with melancholy and despondency. <i>A <b>gloomy</b> corridor badly lit by oil lamps.</i>
<b>grammar</b>	A book on grammar. <i>Chomskyan <b>grammar</b>.</i>
<b><u>grim</u></b>	Causing dejection. <i><b>Grim</b> laughter.</i>
<b>joyless</b>	Not giving or feeling any pleasure or satisfaction; grim or dismal. <i>She had to face the thought of a <b>joyless</b> future.</i>
<b><u>melancholy</u></b>	A humor that was once believed to be secreted by the kidneys or spleen and to cause sadness and melancholy. <i>A dark <b>melancholy</b> young man with deep set eyes.</i>
<b>orthography</b>	The study of spelling and how letters combine to represent sounds and form words. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned <b>orthography</b>.</i>
<b><u>parse</u></b>	An act of parsing a string or a text. <i>A failed <b>parse</b> was retried.</i>
<b>sadden</b>	Cause to feel sorrow; make unhappy. <i>The news of her death <b>saddened</b> me.</i>
<b><u>sorry</u></b>	In a poor or pitiful state. <i><b>Sorry</b> I was trying not to make a noise.</i>
<b><u>spelling</u></b>	Forming words with letters according to the principles underlying accepted usage. <i>The books and <b>spelling</b> in my class were too simple.</i>
<b>sulky</b>	Expressing or suggesting gloom and bad temper. <i>Disappointment was making her <b>sulky</b>.</i>
<b>sullen</b>	A sulky or depressed mood. <i>A <b>sullen</b> sunless sky.</i>
<b><u>syntax</u></b>	A set of rules for or an analysis of the syntax of a language. <i>Generative <b>syntax</b>.</i>
<b>unhappy</b>	Unfortunate. <i>The <b>unhappy</b> or sad news.</i>
<b>vocabulary</b>	A listing of the words used in some enterprise. <i>The term became part of business <b>vocabulary</b>.</i>
