Pitifully or disgracefully bad. dismal

The first **dismal** dispiriting days of November.

Marked by low spirits; showing no enthusiasm. dispirited

A **dispirited** and divided Party.

A shaft dug in a mine for extra ventilation. downcast

A downcast glance.

Depressingly dull and bleak or repetitive. dreary

A series of **dreary** dinner parties.

Verses in an elegiac metre. elegiac

Haunting and **elegiac** poems.

Be or look depressed or despondent. gloom

A year of economic **gloom** for the car industry.

Depressingly dark. gloomy

A **gloomy** corridor badly lit by oil lamps.

Cause great distress to (someone. grieve

It **grieve**s me to think of you in that house alone.

Depressing or worrying to consider. grim

Took a **grim** view of the economy.

Feeling or causing despair. **hopeless** 

He is a **hopeless** romantic.

Not experiencing or inspiring joy. joyless

She had to face the thought of a **joyless** future.

The passionate and demonstrative activity of expressing grief. mourning

Showing pensive sadness.
