**earliest** Before the usual time or the time expected.

### Usage Examples of "Soonest" as an adverb

- *The soonest I can arrive is 3 P.M.*

## Associations of "Soonest" (30 Words)

**after** At a later or future time afterwards.  
*He was sorry in **after** years.*

**approaching** Coming nearer in distance or time.  
*An **approaching** car.*

<b>belated</b>	Coming or happening later than should have been the case. <i>A <b>belated</b> apology.</i>
<b>briefly</b>	For a short time; fleetingly. <i>She replied <b>briefly</b>.</i>
<b>coming</b>	The temporal property of becoming nearer in time. <i>This <b>coming</b> Thursday.</i>
<b>concisely</b>	In a concise manner; in a few words. <i>The history is summed up <b>concisely</b> in this book.</i>
<b>current</b>	The general tendency or course of events or opinion. <i>Keep abreast of <b>current</b> events.</i>
<b>currently</b>	At this time or period; now. <i><b>Currently</b> they live in Connecticut.</i>
<b>forthcoming</b>	Available when required or as promised. <i>Federal funds were not <b>forthcoming</b>.</i>
<b>freshly</b>	Very recently. <i><b>Freshly</b> ground black pepper.</i>
<b>future</b>	Bulk commodities bought or sold at an agreed price for delivery at a specified future date. <i><b>Future</b> auxiliary.</i>
<b>hereafter</b>	Following this in time or order or place; after this. <i>He d promised that Rachel would be the idol of his heart <b>hereafter</b>.</i>
<b>impending</b>	Close in time; about to occur. <i>His <b>impending</b> retirement.</i>
<b>late</b>	Of a later stage in the development of a language or literature used especially of dead languages. <i>The train arrived <b>late</b>.</i>
<b>lately</b>	In the recent past. <i><b>Lately</b> the rules have been enforced.</i>
<b>latest</b>	Up to the immediate present; most recent or most up-to-date. <i>The very <b>latest</b> scientific discoveries.</i>
<b>newly</b>	Only just; recently. <i>Social confidence for the <b>newly</b> single.</i>
<b>now</b>	In these times. <i>They should be back by <b>now</b>.</i>
<b>nowadays</b>	The period of time that is happening now; any continuous stretch of time including the moment of speech. <i><b>Nowadays</b> many people condemn hunting.</i>

<b><u>overtake</u></b>	Catch up with and possibly overtake. <i>Germany rapidly overtook Britain in industrial output.</i>
<b>precocity</b>	Intelligence achieved far ahead of normal developmental schedules.
<b>present</b>	A present tense. <i>We cannot <b>represent</b> this knowledge to our formal reason.</i>
<b>presently</b>	At this time or period; now. <i>He is <b>presently</b> our ambassador to the United Nations.</i>
<b>recent</b>	New. <i>A <b>recent</b> edition of the newspaper.</i>
<b>recently</b>	In the recent past. <i>Until <b>recently</b> we had a female doctor.</i>
<b><u>shortly</u></b>	At a short distance. <i>The book will appear <b>shortly</b>.</i>
<b><u>thereafter</u></b>	From that time on. <i><b>Thereafter</b> he never called again.</i>
<b>timing</b>	The time when something happens. <i>One of the secrets of cricket is good <b>timing</b>.</i>
<b><u>today</u></b>	The present time or age. <i>She s thirty <b>today</b>.</i>
<b>upcoming</b>	About to happen; forthcoming. <i>The <b>upcoming</b> election.</i>
