- Reducing pain or discomfort.






## Synonyms of "Soothing" as an adjective (15 Words)

assuasive	Soothing or calming. <i>Trombone and piano combine in a tone at once astringent and oddly</i> <i>assuasive</i> .
calm	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>Calm seas.</i>
calmative	(of a drug) having a sedative effect.
<u>mild</u>	Mild and pleasant. A <b>mild</b> rebuke.
palliative	Moderating pain or sorrow by making it easier to bear. Short term <b>palliative</b> measures had been taken.
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <b>Peaceful</b> sleep.
<u>placid</u>	Calm and peaceful, with little movement or activity. <i>Remained</i> <b>placid</b> <i>despite the repeated delays</i> .



quiet	Characterized by an absence or near absence of agitation or activity. <i>The car has a <b>quiet</b> economical engine.</i>
<u>reassuring</u>	Serving or intended to remove someone's doubts or fears. A very <b>reassuring</b> remark.
relaxing	Reducing tension or anxiety. The warm water was very <b>relaxing</b> .
reposeful	Having a calm and soothing quality; tranquil. The desire for <b>reposeful</b> contemplation.
<u>restful</u>	Affording physical or mental rest. The rooms were cool and <b>restful</b> .
<u>soporific</u>	Tediously boring or monotonous. The motion of the train had a somewhat <b>soporific</b> effect.
<u>tranquil</u>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. The sea was <b>tranquil</b> .
	Tonding to soothe or tranguilize

**tranquillizing** Tending to soothe or tranquilize. The large windows accentuate the **tranquillizing** view.






#### Usage Examples of "Soothing" as an adjective

# Associations of "Soothing" (30 Words)

An antiseptic compound or preparation. The <b>antiseptic</b> effect of alcohol.
Intended to pacify by acceding to demands or granting concessions. The <b>appeasing</b> concessions to the Nazis at Munich.
An astringent lotion applied to the skin to reduce bleeding from minor abrasions or as a cosmetic to make the skin less oily. An <b>astringent</b> skin lotion.
The resinous substance yielded by a balm. <i>The murmur of the water can provide</i> <b>balm</b> <i>for troubled spirits.</i>
A strip of woven material used to bind up a wound or to protect an injured part of the body. <i>Her leg was swathed in bandages.</i>
The act of appeasing (as by acceding to the demands of.
Aromatic analgesic oil extracted from cloves and used medicinally to relieve dental pain. A teaspoon of ground <b>clove</b> s.
Providing freedom from worry. A <b>comforting</b> bowl of soup.
Intended to placate. A <b>conciliatory</b> visit.
A sweet of a specified flavour which is creamy in texture. <i>Skim cream</i> from the surface of milk.
A substance that relieves irritation of the mucous membranes in the mouth by forming a protective film.
Aromatic threadlike foliage of the dill plant used as seasoning.
Preventing infection by inhibiting the growth or action of microorganisms. All surfaces are cleaned manually or by pressure washer with <b>disinfectant</b> .
Extremely pleasant in a gentle way. The most <b>dulcet</b> swimming on the most beautiful and remote beaches.
(of a substance) causing vomiting. That <b>emetic</b> music endemic to department stores.
Having a softening or soothing effect especially to the skin. Always moisturize exposed skin with an effective <b>emollient</b> .
The natural process by which the body repairs itself. <i>The <b>healing</b> process.</i>



hemostatic	Tending to check bleeding by contracting the tissues or blood vessels.
laxative	A medicine which has a laxative effect. <i>The laxative properties of sodium sulphate.</i>
liniment	An embrocation for rubbing on the body to relieve pain, especially one made with oil.
ointment	Semisolid preparation (usually containing a medicine) applied externally as a remedy or for soothing an irritation. <i>He rubbed some ointment on his leg.</i>
placating	Intended to pacify by acceding to demands or granting concessions. <i>Placating</i> or placative gestures.
propitiate	Make peace with. The pagans thought it was important to <b>propitiate</b> the gods with sacrifices.
propitiatory	Having power to atone for or offered by way of expiation or propitiation. <i>Expiatory or propitiatory sacrifice.</i>
<u>reassuring</u>	Serving or intended to remove someone's doubts or fears. A very <b>reassuring</b> remark.
relaxing	Affording physical or mental rest. A <b>relaxing</b> massage with aromatherapy oils.
relief	A piece of sculpture in relief. Employees who donate to charity will receive tax <b>relief</b> .
salve	Apply a salve to usually for the purpose of healing. <i>He needed a <b>salve</b> for his conscience.</i>
thyme	Any of various mints of the genus Thymus.
unction	Anointing as part of a religious ceremony or healing ritual. <i>Mercury in the form of <b>unction</b>s.</i>
