- *Intellectually appealing.*
- *Having, revealing, or involving a great deal of worldly experience and knowledge of fashion and culture.*
- *(of a machine, system, or technique) developed to a high degree of complexity.*
- *Having or appealing to those having worldly knowledge and refinement and savoir-faire.*
- *Ahead in development; complex or intricate.*

- cosmopolitan** Composed of people from or at home in many parts of the world; especially not provincial in attitudes or interests- T.B. Macaulay.  
*The ancient and **cosmopolitan** societies of Syria and Egypt.*
- enlightened** Having or showing a rational, modern, and well-informed outlook.  
*The more **enlightened** employers offer better terms.*
- experienced** Having gained knowledge or skill in a particular field over time.  
*An **experienced** social worker.*
- knowledgeable** Highly educated; having extensive information or understanding.  
*A **knowledgeable** audience.*
- revolutionary** Markedly new or introducing radical change.  
*A **revolutionary** discovery.*

- trailblazing** Introducing new ideas or methods; innovative or pioneering.  
*The journalist businesswoman and author spoke about her **trailblazing** career.*
- worldly** Of or concerned with material values or ordinary life rather than a spiritual existence.  
***Worldly** goods and advancement.*
- worldly-wise** Experienced in and wise to the ways of the world.

(of a pearl) formed round a foreign body inserted into an oyster.

<b>debonair</b>	Having a sophisticated charm. <i>Life that is gay brisk and <b>debonair</b>.</i>
<b>delicate</b>	A delicate fabric or garment. <i>A <b>delicate</b> sweet flavour.</i>
<b>elegance</b>	The quality of being pleasingly ingenious and simple; neatness. <i>The simplicity and <b>elegance</b> of the solution.</i>
<b>elegant</b>	Displaying effortless beauty and simplicity in movement or execution. <i>She will look <b>elegant</b> in black.</i>
<b>enchantingly</b>	In a bewitching manner.
<b>gentility</b>	Elegance by virtue of fineness of manner and expression. <i>Her grandmother's pretensions to <b>gentility</b>.</i>
<b>glorify</b>	Praise glorify or honor. <i>Music is used to <b>glorify</b> God.</i>
<b>grace</b>	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>It was debated whether saving <b>grace</b> could be obtained outside the membership of the church.</i>
<b>graceful</b>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b>.</i>
<b>gracefully</b>	In a gracious or graceful manner. <i>He has aged <b>gracefully</b>.</i>
<b>jaunty</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>There was no mistaking that <b>jaunty</b> walk.</i>
<b>lissom</b>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to <b>lissom</b> teenagers.</i>
<b>lithe</b>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. <i>She lay gazing up at his tall <b>lithe</b> figure.</i>
<b>mincing</b>	Affectedly dainty or refined. <i>I don't have to go through the rest of my life with that <b>mincing</b> voice of yours.</i>
<b>polished</b>	Shiny as a result of being rubbed. <i><b>Polished</b> rice.</i>
<b>refined</b>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was delicate and <b>refined</b> and unused to hardship.</i>
<b>slender</b>	Being of delicate or slender build Frank Norris. <i>Her <b>slender</b> neck.</i>

<b>slim</b>	A course or period of slimming. <i>There was just a <b>slim</b> chance of success.</i>
<b>sophistication</b>	Falsification by the use of sophistry; misleading by means of specious fallacies. <i>He practiced the art of <b>sophistication</b> upon reason.</i>
<b>suave</b>	Charming, confident, and elegant (typically used of a man). <i>All the waiters were <b>suave</b> and deferential.</i>
<b>supple</b>	Capable of moving or bending freely. <i>A <b>supple</b> mind.</i>
<b>svelte</b>	Moving and bending with ease. <i>She was <b>svelte</b> and sophisticated.</i>
<b>tasteful</b>	Free from what is tawdry or unbecoming. <i>A <b>tasteful</b> lounge bar.</i>
<b>thin</b>	Relatively thin in consistency or low in density not viscous. <i>You can't be too rich or too <b>thin</b>.</i>
<b>urbane</b>	Courteous and refined in manner (typically used of a man). <i>Maintained an <b>urbane</b> tone in his letters.</i>
<b>willowy</b>	(of a person) tall, slim, and lithe. <i><b>Willowy</b> meadow land.</i>
