- *(of a person or their thoughts, reactions, and understanding) aware of and able to interpret complex issues; subtle.*
- *Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated.*
- *Intellectually appealing.*
- *Having, revealing, or involving a great deal of worldly experience and knowledge of fashion and culture.*
- *(of a machine, system, or technique) developed to a high degree of complexity.*
- *Having or appealing to those having worldly knowledge and refinement and savoir-faire.*
- *Ahead in development; complex or intricate.*

advanced	Situated ahead or going before. <i>Special seminars for small groups of advanced students at the University.</i>
<u>cosmopolitan</u>	Composed of people from or at home in many parts of the world; especially not provincial in attitudes or interests- T.B. Macaulay. <i>The ancient and cosmopolitan societies of Syria and Egypt.</i>
enlightened	Having or showing a rational, modern, and well-informed outlook. <i>The more enlightened employers offer better terms.</i>
experienced	Having gained knowledge or skill in a particular field over time. <i>An experienced social worker.</i>
knowledgeable	Highly educated; having extensive information or understanding. <i>A knowledgeable audience.</i>
<u>revolutionary</u>	Markedly new or introducing radical change. <i>A revolutionary discovery.</i>

trailblazing	Introducing new ideas or methods; innovative or pioneering. <i>The journalist businesswoman and author spoke about her trailblazing career.</i>
worldly	Of or concerned with material values or ordinary life rather than a spiritual existence. <i>Worldly goods and advancement.</i>
worldly-wise	Experienced in and wise to the ways of the world.

<u>charming</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>He was a charming affectionate colleague.</i>
cultivated	Prepared for raising crops by plowing or fertilizing. <i>Cultivated roses.</i>
cultured	(of a pearl) formed round a foreign body inserted into an oyster. <i>Cultured tastes.</i>

debonair	Having a sophisticated charm. <i>Life that is gay brisk and debonair.</i>
delicate	A delicate fabric or garment. <i>A delicate sweet flavour.</i>
elegance	The quality of being pleasingly ingenious and simple; neatness. <i>The simplicity and elegance of the solution.</i>
elegant	Displaying effortless beauty and simplicity in movement or execution. <i>She will look elegant in black.</i>
enchantly	In a bewitching manner.
gentility	Elegance by virtue of fineness of manner and expression. <i>Her grandmother's pretensions to gentility.</i>
glorify	Praise glorify or honor. <i>Music is used to glorify God.</i>
<u>grace</u>	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>It was debated whether saving grace could be obtained outside the membership of the church.</i>
<u>graceful</u>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was a tall girl slender and graceful.</i>
gracefully	In a gracious or graceful manner. <i>He has aged gracefully.</i>
jaunty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>There was no mistaking that jaunty walk.</i>
lissom	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to lissom teenagers.</i>
<u>lithe</u>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. <i>She lay gazing up at his tall lithe figure.</i>
mincing	Affectedly dainty or refined. <i>I don't have to go through the rest of my life with that mincing voice of yours.</i>
<u>polished</u>	Shiny as a result of being rubbed. <i>Polished rice.</i>
<u>refined</u>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was delicate and refined and unused to hardship.</i>
<u>slender</u>	Being of delicate or slender build Frank Norris. <i>Her slender neck.</i>

slim	A course or period of slimming. <i>There was just a slim chance of success.</i>
sophistication	Falsification by the use of sophistry; misleading by means of specious fallacies. <i>He practiced the art of sophistication upon reason.</i>
<u>suave</u>	Charming, confident, and elegant (typically used of a man). <i>All the waiters were suave and deferential.</i>
<u>supple</u>	Capable of moving or bending freely. <i>A supple mind.</i>
svelte	Moving and bending with ease. <i>She was svelte and sophisticated.</i>
<u>tasteful</u>	Free from what is tawdry or unbecoming. <i>A tasteful lounge bar.</i>
<u>thin</u>	Relatively thin in consistency or low in density not viscous. <i>You can't be too rich or too thin.</i>
urbane	Courteous and refined in manner (typically used of a man). <i>Maintained an urbane tone in his letters.</i>
willowy	(of a person) tall, slim, and lithe. <i>Willowy meadow land.</i>
