- (of a machine, system, or technique) developed to a high degree of complexity.
- Having or appealing to those having worldly knowledge and refinement and savoirfaire.
- Ahead in development; complex or intricate.






# Synonyms of "Sophisticated" as an adjective (9 Words)

advanced	Situated ahead or going before. Special seminars for small groups of <b>advanced</b> students at the University.
<u>cosmopolitan</u>	Composed of people from or at home in many parts of the world; especially not provincial in attitudes or interests- T.B. Macaulay. <i>The ancient and</i> <b>cosmopolitan</b> societies of Syria and Egypt.
enlightened	Having or showing a rational, modern, and well-informed outlook. The more <b>enlightened</b> employers offer better terms.
experienced	Having gained knowledge or skill in a particular field over time. An <b>experienced</b> social worker.
knowledgeable	Highly educated; having extensive information or understanding. A <b>knowledgeable</b> audience.
<u>revolutionary</u>	Markedly new or introducing radical change. A <b>revolutionary</b> discovery.



trailblazing	Introducing new ideas or methods; innovative or pioneering. The journalist businesswoman and author spoke about her <b>trailblazing</b> career.
worldly	Of or concerned with material values or ordinary life rather than a spiritual existence. <i>Worldly</i> goods and advancement.
worldly-wise	Experienced in and wise to the ways of the world.

<u>charming</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>He was a <b>charming</b> affectionate colleague.</i>
cultivated	Prepared for raising crops by plowing or fertilizing. <i>Cultivated</i> roses.
cultured	(of a pearl) formed round a foreign body inserted into an oyster. <i>Cultured tastes</i> .



debonair	Having a sophisticated charm. Life that is gay brisk and <b>debonair</b> .
delicate	A delicate fabric or garment. A <b>delicate</b> sweet flavour.
elegance	The quality of being pleasingly ingenious and simple; neatness. The simplicity and <b>elegance</b> of the solution.
elegant	Displaying effortless beauty and simplicity in movement or execution. <i>She will look <b>elegant</b> in black.</i>
enchantingly	In a bewitching manner.
gentility	Elegance by virtue of fineness of manner and expression. <i>Her grandmother s pretensions to <b>gentility</b>.</i>
glorify	Praise glorify or honor. Music is used to <b>glorify</b> God.
<u>grace</u>	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. It was debated whether saving <b>grace</b> could be obtained outside the membership of the church.
<u>graceful</u>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b> .
gracefully	In a gracious or graceful manner. He has aged <b>gracefully</b> .
jaunty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. There was no mistaking that <b>jaunty</b> walk.
lissom	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. The kind of outfit that should be left to <b>lissom</b> teenagers.
<u>lithe</u>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. She lay gazing up at his tall <b>lithe</b> figure.
mincing	Affectedly dainty or refined. I don t have to go through the rest of my life with that <b>mincing</b> voice of yours.
<u>polished</u>	Shiny as a result of being rubbed. <i>Polished</i> rice.
<u>refined</u>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. She was delicate and <b>refined</b> and unused to hardship.
<u>slender</u>	Being of delicate or slender build Frank Norris. Her <b>slender</b> neck.



slim	A course or period of slimming. There was just a <b>slim</b> chance of success.
sophistication	Falsification by the use of sophistry; misleading by means of specious fallacies. <i>He practiced the art of <b>sophistication</b> upon reason.</i>
<u>suave</u>	Charming, confident, and elegant (typically used of a man. All the waiters were <b>suave</b> and deferential.
<u>supple</u>	Capable of moving or bending freely. A <b>supple</b> mind.
svelte	Moving and bending with ease. She was <b>svelte</b> and sophisticated.
<u>tasteful</u>	Free from what is tawdry or unbecoming. A <b>tasteful</b> lounge bar.
<u>thin</u>	Relatively thin in consistency or low in density not viscous. <i>You can t be too rich or too <b>thin</b>.</i>
urbane	Courteous and refined in manner (typically used of a man. <i>Maintained an</i> <b>urbane</b> tone in his letters.
willowy	(of a person) tall, slim, and lithe. <i>Willowy</i> meadow land.
