<b>calmative</b>	A calmative drug.
<b>hypnotic</b>	A person under or open to hypnosis. <i>Hypnotics may be prescribed.</i>
<b>narcotic</b>	A drug that produces numbness or stupor; often taken for pleasure or to reduce pain; extensive use can lead to addiction. <i>Cultivation of a plant used to make a popular local <b>narcotic</b>.</i>

<b>sedative</b>	A drug that reduces excitability and calms a person. <i>A mild <b>sedative</b>.</i>

<b>sleeping potion</b>	The state of being asleep.
<b>tranquillizer</b>	A medicinal drug taken to reduce tension or anxiety.

### Synonyms of "Soporific" as an adjective (13 Words)

<b>calmative</b>	(of a drug) having a sedative effect.
<b><u>drowsy</u></b>	Causing sleepiness. <i>The <b>drowsy</b> heat of the meadows.</i>
<b>hypnagogic</b>	Sleep inducing.
<b>hypnogogic</b>	Sleep inducing.
<b>narcotic</b>	Of or relating to or designating narcotics. <i>A <b>narcotic</b> speech.</i>
<b>sedative</b>	Promoting calm or inducing sleep. <i>Took a hot drink with <b>sedative</b> properties before going to bed.</i>
<b><u>sleepy</u></b>	Ready to fall asleep. <i>She rubbed her <b>sleepy</b> eyes.</i>
<b>somniferous</b>	Tending to induce sleep; soporific. <i>Lifeless actors made the experience even more <b>somniferous</b> for the audiences.</i>
<b>somnific</b>	Tending to induce sleep; soporific. <i><b>Somnific</b> medicines.</i>

<b>somnolent</b>	Sleepy; drowsy. A <b>somnolent</b> summer day.
<b>soporiferous</b>	Sleep inducing. (of a drug) having a calming or sedative effect.
<b>tranquillizing</b>	The majority regarded <b>tranquillizing</b> drugs as the chief therapeutic weapon.

## Usage Examples of "Soporific" as an adjective

- Some medicine made her soporific.
- A libel trial is in large parts intensely soporific.
- The motion of the train had a somewhat soporific effect.

## Associations of "Soporific" (30 Words)

<b>analgesic</b>	An analgesic drug. An <b>analgesic</b> effect.
<b>anodyne</b>	A painkilling drug or medicine. An <b>anodyne</b> to the misery she had put him through.
<b>antihistamine</b>	A drug or other compound that inhibits the physiological effects of histamine, used especially in the treatment of allergies. An <b>antihistamine</b> injection.
<b>antispasmodic</b>	An antispasmodic drug.
<b>aspirin</b>	(in general use) a tablet of any mild painkilling drug.
<b>downer</b>	A drug that reduces excitability and calms a person. During that week I was heavily doped on <b>downers</b> .
<b>drug</b>	Administer a drug to. Mass adoration is a highly addictive <b>drug</b> .
<b>enthrall</b>	Hold spellbound.
<b>hypnotic</b>	Attracting and holding interest as if by a spell. A <b>hypnotic</b> state.
<b>medication</b>	Treatment using drugs. Chronic gastrointestinal symptoms may require prolonged <b>medication</b> .
<b>mesmerize</b>	Attract strongly, as if with a magnet. He was <b>mesmerized</b> when at the point of death.
<b>moderating</b>	Lessening in intensity or strength.

<b>narcotic</b>	Relating to or denoting narcotics or illegal drugs. <i>Pethidine usually given as an injection is a <b>narcotic</b> which causes drowsiness.</i>
<b>painkiller</b>	A drug or a medicine for relieving pain.
<b><u>paralyzed</u></b>	Affected with paralysis.
<b>pill</b>	An oral contraceptive in pill form. <i>His competitor's success was a bitter <b>pill</b> to take.</i>
<b>prescription</b>	Available only with a doctor's written prescription. <i>The lotion is available on <b>prescription</b>.</i>
<b>relaxant</b>	A drug used to promote relaxation or reduce tension. <i>If you are tense try some of the <b>relaxant</b> products available at health stores.</i>
<b>sedative</b>	Tending to soothe or tranquilize. <i>A mild <b>sedative</b>.</i>
<b>sleeping</b>	Lying with head on paws as if sleeping. <i>It was 30 degrees at 1 a.m. a few weeks ago and <b>sleeping</b> was near impossible.</i>
<b>soothe</b>	Cause to feel better. <i>To <b>soothe</b> the skin try chamomile or thyme.</i>
<b>spellbind</b>	Put into a trance. <i>The singer held the audience spellbound.</i>
<b>state</b>	The three traditional states of matter are solids fixed shape and volume and liquids fixed volume and shaped by the container and gases filling the container. <i>Don't get into a <b>state</b>.</i>
<b>stimulant</b>	A drug that temporarily quickens some vital process. <i><b>Stimulant</b> phenomena.</i>
<b><u>tablet</u></b>	A flat slab of stone, clay, or wood, used especially for an inscription. <i>Ecstasy <b>tablets</b>.</i>
<b>toothache</b>	An ache localized in or around a tooth. <i>He has a <b>toothache</b>.</i>
<b><u>trance</u></b>	Put into a trance. <i>She's been <b>tranced</b> and may need waking.</i>
<b>tranquilizer</b>	A drug used to reduce stress or tension without reducing mental clarity.
<b>uninteresting</b>	Not arousing curiosity or interest. <i>The scenery is dull and <b>uninteresting</b>.</i>
