black magician	A person with dark skin who comes from Africa (or whose ancestors came from Africa).
diviner	Someone who claims to discover hidden knowledge with the aid of supernatural powers.
enchanter	A sorcerer or magician.
enchantress	A woman who is considered to be dangerously seductive.
<u>magician</u>	A conjuror. <i>He was the magician of the fan belt.</i>
magus	A sorcerer.
medicine man	Punishment for one's actions.

medicine woman	Punishment for one's actions.
necromancer	A person who practises necromancy; a wizard or magician. <i>Dr Faustus a necromancer of the 16th century.</i>
occultist	A believer in occultism; someone versed in the occult arts.
<u>shaman</u>	In societies practicing shamanism one acting as a medium between the visible and spirit worlds practices sorcery for healing or divination.
sorceress	A woman sorcerer.
thaumaturge	A worker of wonders and performer of miracles; a magician.
thaumaturgist	One who practices magic or sorcery.
warlock	A male witch or demon.
<u>witch</u>	A follower or practitioner of Wicca or of modern witchcraft. <i>He can marry the old witch for all I care.</i>
witch doctor	A female sorcerer or magician.
<u>wizard</u>	A help feature of a software package that automates complex tasks by asking the user a series of easy-to-answer questions. <i>A financial wizard.</i>

alchemist

A person who practises alchemy.

*Some highly imaginative tax shelters dreamed up by the accounting **alchemists**.*

amulet

An ornament or small piece of jewellery thought to give protection against evil, danger, or disease.

astrologer

Someone who predicts the future by the positions of the planets and sun and Moon.

*He was advised by **astrologers** to delay his departure.*

<u>broom</u>	Finish with a broom.
captivated	Filled with wonder and delight.
charmed	(of a particle) possessing the property charm. <i>I felt that I had a charmed life.</i>
<u>conjure</u>	Ask for or request earnestly. <i>She had forgotten how to conjure up the image of her mother s face.</i>
coven	A group or meeting of witches. <i>Covens of militants within the party.</i>
crone	An ugly evil-looking old woman.
delighted	Feeling or showing great pleasure. <i>A delighted smile.</i>
disbelieve	Reject as false; refuse to accept. <i>He seemed to disbelieve her.</i>
hypnotist	A person who induces hypnosis. <i>A stage hypnotist.</i>
hypnotize	Induce hypnosis in. <i>She gazed down hypnotized by the swirling tide.</i>
magic	An illusory feat considered magical by naive observers. <i>A magic wand.</i>
<u>magical</u>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers. <i>It was a magical evening of pure nostalgia.</i>
<u>magician</u>	Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience. <i>He was the magician of the fan belt.</i>
<u>mystic</u>	Relating to or resembling mysticism. <i>Mystical intuition.</i>
necromancer	One who practices divination by conjuring up the dead. <i>Dr Faustus a necromancer of the 16th century.</i>
necromancy	The supposed practice of communicating with the dead, especially in order to predict the future. <i>Alchemy necromancy and other magic practices.</i>
seance	A meeting at which people attempt to make contact with the dead, especially through the agency of a medium. <i>The seance was held in the medium s parlor.</i>
<u>shaman</u>	In societies practicing shamanism one acting as a medium between the visible and spirit worlds practices sorcery for healing or divination.

sleight	Adroitness in using the hands. <i>Except by sleight of logic the two positions cannot be harmonized.</i>
sorcery	The use of magic, especially black magic.
<u>spell</u>	Orally recite the letters of or give the spelling of. <i>A spell of work.</i>
<u>talisman</u>	An object, typically an inscribed ring or stone, that is thought to have magic powers and to bring good luck. <i>A dolphin talisman would ensure a safe journey on land or at sea.</i>
<u>trance</u>	Put into a trance. <i>In the Hades Warehouse there s the finest in trance and techno.</i>
<u>witch</u>	A woman who is bewitchingly attractive. <i>He can marry the old witch for all I care.</i>
<u>witchcraft</u>	Bewitching or fascinating attraction or charm. <i>Children and goods were believed to be vulnerable to the witchcraft of jealous neighbours.</i>
<u>wizard</u>	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>I ve just had a wizard idea.</i>
