| <b>different</b>            | Distinctly separate from the first.<br><i>Came to a <b>different</b> conclusion.</i>   |
| <a href="#">dissimilar</a>  | Marked by dissimilarity.<br><i>Their understanding of the world is not so <b>dissimilar</b> from our own.</i>  |
| <a href="#">distinguish</a> | Be an identifying characteristic or mark of.<br><i>His modesty <b>distinguishes</b> him from his peers.</i>  |
| <b>diverse</b>              | Distinctly dissimilar or unlike.<br><i>Subjects as <b>diverse</b> as architecture language teaching and the physical sciences.</i>   |
| <b>diversity</b>            | The practice or quality of including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc.<br><i>Equality and <b>diversity</b> should be supported for their own sake.</i> |
| <b>hierarchic</b>           | Classified according to various criteria into successive levels or layers.<br><i>In her <b>hierarchic</b> set of values honesty comes first.</i>   |

| <b>identify</b>            | Give the name or identifying characteristics of refer to by name or some other identifying characteristic property.<br><i>3.2% of the men identified as gay or bisexual.</i> |
| <b>miscellaneous</b>       | (of items or people gathered or considered together) of various types or from different sources.<br><i>Miscellaneous accessories.</i>  |
| <b>miscellany</b>          | A collection containing a variety of sorts of things.<br><i>A miscellany of houses.</i>  |
| <b>motley</b>              | Make motley color with different colors.<br><i>A jester dressed in motley.</i>   |
| <b><u>multifaceted</u></b> | Having many different aspects or features.<br><i>A multifaceted undertaking.</i>   |
| <b>multifarious</b>        | Having many aspects.<br><i>A vast multifarious organization.</i>   |
| <b>multiplicity</b>        | A large number.<br><i>The demand for higher education depends on a multiplicity of factors.</i>  |
| <b>nomenclature</b>        | The body or system of names used in a particular specialist field.<br><i>Customers was preferred to the original nomenclature passengers.</i>                                |
| <b>pastiche</b>            | Imitate the style of (an artist or work).<br><i>The songs amount to much more than blatant pastiche.</i>   |
| <b>pigeonhole</b>          | Put a document in a pigeonhole.<br><i>People identified me with a homely farmer s wife and I could never escape that pigeonhole.</i>   |
| <b>pluralism</b>           | A form of society in which the members of minority groups maintain their independent cultural traditions.  |
| <b>potpourri</b>           | A mixture of dried petals and spices placed in a bowl to perfume a room.<br><i>He played a potpourri of tunes from Gilbert and Sullivan.</i>                                 |
| <b><u>sorting</u></b>      | The basic cognitive process of arranging into classes or categories.<br><i>The bottleneck in mail delivery is the process of sorting.</i>                                    |
| <b><u>stratified</u></b>   | Formed or arranged into strata or layers.<br><i>Warming temperatures can lead to more stratified ocean layers.</i>   |
| <b>taxonomy</b>            | Study of the general principles of scientific classification.<br><i>The taxonomy of these fossils.</i>   |
| <b>type</b>                | Write something on a typewriter or computer by pressing the keys.<br><i>Small type is hard to read.</i>  |
| <b>variety</b>             | A collection containing a variety of sorts of things.<br><i>The range and variety of his work is amazing.</i>  |
