ally	A state formally cooperating with another for a military or other purpose. <i>He was forced to dismiss his closest political ally.</i>
associate	A concept connected with another. <i>First was the lightning and then its thunderous associate.</i>
best friend	Canadian physiologist (born in the United States) who assisted F. G. Banting in research leading to the discovery of insulin (1899-1978).
boon companion	A desirable state.
bosom friend	A close affectionate and protective acceptance.
classmate	A fellow member of a class at school, college, or university.
close friend	The concluding part of any performance.
companion	One paid to accompany or assist or live with another. <i>A traveller s companion.</i>

<u>comrade</u>	Used as a term of address for those male persons engaged in the same movement. <i>You re right comrade.</i>
<u>confidant</u>	Someone to whom private matters are confided. <i>A close confidante of the princess.</i>
confidante	A female confidant.
<u>familiar</u>	A demon supposedly attending and obeying a witch, often said to assume the form of an animal. <i>Her familiars were her two little griffons that nested in her skirts.</i>
intimate	A very close friend. <i>His circle of intimates.</i>
playfellow	A companion at play. <i>They had been his boyhood playfellows.</i>
playmate	Used euphemistically to refer to a person's lover. <i>Her clients use this album of photos to pick their ideal playmate.</i>
schoolmate	An acquaintance that you go to school with. <i>I ran into an old schoolmate of mine.</i>
second self	An indefinitely short time.
<u>shadow</u>	A region of opacity on a radiograph. <i>A shadow over his happiness.</i>
soul mate	A human being.
workmate	A fellow worker.
