## Synonyms of "Spacious" as an adjective (24 Words)

<b><u>airy</u></b>	Having little or no perceptible weight; so light as to resemble air. <i>A large <b>airy</b> room.</i>
<b>ample</b>	Enough or more than enough; plentiful. <i>Of <b>ample</b> proportions.</i>
<b>big</b>	Generous and understanding and tolerant. <i>A heart <b>big</b> enough to hold no grudges.</i>
<b>broad</b>	Broad in scope or content. <i>The valley is three miles long and half a mile <b>broad</b>.</i>
<b>capacious</b>	Large in capacity. <i>She rummaged in her <b>capacious</b> handbag.</i>
<b>commodious</b>	Large and roomy ('convenient' is archaic in this sense). <i>They moved to a more <b>commodious</b> dwelling.</i>
<b><u>expansive</u></b>	Marked by exaggerated feelings of euphoria and delusions of grandeur. <i>The <b>expansive</b> force of fire.</i>

<b>extensive</b>	(of agriculture) obtaining a relatively small crop from a large area with a minimum of capital and labour. <i>An <b>extensive</b> Roman settlement in northwest England.</i>
<b>generous</b>	More than adequate. <i>Unusually <b>generous</b> in his judgment of people.</i>
<b>high-ceilinged</b>	Having a higher than normal ceiling.
<b>immense</b>	Extremely large or great, especially in scale or degree. <i>The Los Angeles aqueduct winds like an <b>immense</b> snake along the base of the mountains.</i>
<b>large</b>	Fairly large or important in effect influential. <i>Many <b>large</b> investors are likely to take a different view.</i>
<b>open</b>	Of a note sounded from an open string or pipe. <i>Keep your eyes <b>open</b>.</i>
<b>palatial</b>	Resembling a palace in being spacious and splendid. <i>Her <b>palatial</b> apartment in Mayfair.</i>
<b><u>rambling</u></b>	(of e.g. speech and writing) tending to depart from the main point or cover a wide range of subjects. <i><b>Rambling</b> forest paths.</i>
<b>rolling</b>	Uttered with a trill. <i>A <b>rolling</b> ball.</i>
<b>roomy</b>	(especially of accommodation) having plenty of room; spacious. <i>A <b>roomy</b> but sparsely furnished apartment.</i>
<b>sizeable</b>	Fairly large in size. <i>A <b>sizeable</b> apartment.</i>
<b><u>substantial</u></b>	Fairly large. <i>A mere dream neither <b>substantial</b> nor practical.</i>
<b><u>sweeping</u></b>	Wide in range or effect. <i><b>Sweeping</b> desolate moorlands.</i>
<b>vast</b>	Of very great extent or quantity; immense. <i>The <b>vast</b> reaches of outer space.</i>
<b>voluminous</b>	(of clothes) very loose or full; having much fabric. <i>He sank into a <b>voluminous</b> armchair.</i>
<b><u>wide</u></b>	(after a measurement and in questions) from side to side. <i>His <b>wide</b> circle of friends.</i>
<b>wide open</b>	Not on target.

- abundantly** Extremely.  
*They were **abundantly** supplied with food.*
- adequacy** The quality of being sufficient for the end in view.  
*He questioned the **adequacy** of the usual sentimental interpretation of the Golden Rule.*
- adequate** About average; acceptable.  
*She had **adequate** training.*
- airy** Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air.  
***Airy** theories about socioeconomic improvement.*

<b>ample</b>	Enough or more than enough; plentiful. <i>An <b>ample</b> supply of consumer goods.</i>
<b>big</b>	In a major way. <i>As a senior in college he was a <b>big</b> man on campus.</i>
<b>bountiful</b>	Giving generously. <i>The ocean provided a <b>bountiful</b> supply of fresh food.</i>
<b><u>breadth</u></b>	The extent of something from side to side. <i>The boat measured 27 feet in <b>breadth</b>.</i>
<b>broad</b>	Showing or characterized by broad mindedness. <i>A <b>broad</b> lawn.</i>
<b>capacious</b>	Having a lot of space inside; roomy. <i>She carried a <b>capacious</b> bag.</i>
<b>commodious</b>	Roomy and comfortable. <i>A <b>commodious</b> building suitable for conventions.</i>
<b><u>copious</u></b>	Affording an abundant supply. <i><b>Copious</b> provisions.</i>
<b><u>expanse</u></b>	A wide scope. <i>The moth has a wing <b>expanse</b> of 20 to 24 mm.</i>
<b>extensive</b>	Of agriculture; increasing productivity by using large areas with minimal outlay and labor. <i><b>Extensive</b> farming techniques.</i>
<b><u>extensively</u></b>	To a large or detailed degree. <i>Her husband travelled <b>extensively</b> in his job.</i>
<b>huge</b>	Extremely large; enormous. <i><b>Huge</b> popular demand for higher education.</i>
<b>large</b>	Fairly large or important in effect influential. <i>A big or <b>large</b> barn.</i>
<b><u>lounge</u></b>	A sitting room in a house. <i>A TV <b>lounge</b>.</i>
<b>opened</b>	Used of mouth or eyes. <i>His mouth slightly <b>opened</b>.</i>
<b>panoramic</b>	As from an altitude or distance. <i>A <b>panoramic</b> view.</i>
<b>roomy</b>	(of buildings and rooms) having ample space. <i><b>Roomy</b> trousers.</i>
<b><u>sizable</u></b>	Fairly large in size. <i>A <b>sizable</b> fortune.</i>

- sufficiency** Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort.  
*He questioned the **sufficiency** of human intelligence.*
- sufficient** Of a quantity that can fulfill a need or requirement but without being abundant.  
*They had **sufficient** resources to survive.*
- swath** The space created by the swing of a scythe or the cut of a mowing machine.
- vast** Unusually great in size or amount or degree or especially extent or scope.  
*At **vast** or immense expense.*
- vista** A mental view of a succession of remembered or anticipated events.  
***Vistas** of freedom seemed to open ahead of him.*
- voluminous** Large in volume or bulk.  
*A subject of **voluminous** legislation.*
- wide** A ball that is judged to be too wide of the stumps for the batsman to play for which an extra is awarded to the batting side.  
*How **wide** do you think this house is.*
- wingspan** Linear distance between the extremities of an airfoil.  
*An eagle with a **wingspan** of 7 ft.*
