affordable	Inexpensive; reasonably priced. <i>Affordable homes.</i>
austerity	Plainness and simplicity in appearance. <i>The room was decorated with a restraint bordering on austerity.</i>
bank	Enclose with a bank. <i>Bank roads.</i>
cheap	Embarrassingly stingy. <i>A cheap restaurant.</i>
cheaply	With little expenditure of money. <i>I bought this car very cheaply.</i>
depositor	A person who has deposited money in a bank or similar institution.
economical	Avoiding waste. <i>An economical shopper.</i>
frugal	Sparing or economical as regards money or food. <i>A frugal farmer.</i>
frugality	The quality of being economical with money or food; thriftiness. <i>He scorned the finer things in life and valued frugality and simplicity.</i>
inexpensive	Not costing a great deal; cheap. <i>Inexpensive family restaurants.</i>
meagerly	To a meager degree or in a meager manner. <i>These voices are meagerly represented at the conference.</i>
miser	A stingy hoarder of money and possessions often living miserably. <i>A typical miser he hid his money in the house in various places.</i>
paltry	Not worth considering. <i>She would earn a paltry 33 more a month.</i>
parsimony	Extreme stinginess. <i>A great tradition of public design has been shattered by government parsimony.</i>
redemptive	Bringing about salvation or redemption from sin. <i>Redemptive or redeeming love.</i>
rescue	Denoting or relating to a domestic animal that has been removed from a situation of abuse or neglect by a welfare organization. <i>He got out of his chair to rescue his cup of coffee.</i>

save	Save from sins. <i>Save your strength till later.</i>
saving	Bringing about salvation or redemption from sin. <i>Wealthy by inheritance but saving by constitution.</i>
savings	A fund of money put by as a reserve.
schlock	Merchandise that is shoddy or inferior. <i>Televisual schlock.</i>
scrimp	Subsist on a meager allowance. <i>Scratch and scrimp.</i>
skimp	Work hastily or carelessly; deal with inadequately and superficially. <i>She wore a yellow skimp.</i>
sparing	Moderate; economical. <i>Physicians advised sparing use of the ointment.</i>
sparsely	In a sparse manner. <i>A sparsely populated region.</i>
stinginess	A lack of generosity; a general unwillingness to part with money.
thrift	The quality of using money and other resources carefully and not wastefully. <i>The values of thrift and self reliance.</i>
thriftiness	Frugality in the expenditure of money or resources.
thrifty	Careful and diligent in the use of resources. <i>The sheep are vigorous and thrifty.</i>
tightwad	A mean or miserly person. <i>He is a notorious tightwad.</i>
