foaming	Emitting or filled with bubbles as from carbonation or fermentation. <i>Pints of foaming bitter.</i>
frothy	Light and entertaining but of little substance. <i>Lots of frothy interviews.</i>
gassy	Suffering from excessive gas in the alimentary canal. <i>A long and gassy book.</i>

froth	Make froth or foam and become bubbly. <i>Leave the yeast until there is a good head of froth.</i>
glimmer	Shine faintly with a wavering light. <i>He saw a faint glimmer of light from her window.</i>
glint	A momentary flash of light. <i>Her glasses glinted in the firelight.</i>
glisten	Be shiny, as if wet. <i>There was a glisten of perspiration across her top lip.</i>
glistening	Shining with a sparkling light. <i>Glistening bodies of swimmers.</i>
glitter	The occurrence of a small flash or spark. <i>The scathing glitter in his eyes.</i>
glow	Give out steady light without flame. <i>Make the people s hearts glow.</i>
grin	Express with a broad smile. <i>My word grinned the delighted man.</i>
jewel	A precious or semiprecious stone incorporated into a piece of jewelry. <i>Jeweled dresses.</i>
lustrous	Having lustre; shining. <i>Large lustrous eyes.</i>
moment	A quantity that expresses the average or expected value of the first second third or fourth power of the deviation of each component of a frequency distribution from a given value typically mean or zero The first moment is the mean the second moment the variance the third moment the skew and the fourth moment the kurtosis. <i>She is studying at the moment.</i>
polish	Improve or perfect by pruning or polishing. <i>They performed with great polish.</i>
rekindle	Revive (something lost or lapsed). <i>He tried to rekindle their friendship.</i>
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>My hair has lost its shine.</i>
shining	Marked by exceptional merit. <i>He has set a shining example with his model behaviour.</i>

- shiny** Having a shiny surface or coating.
Shiny black patents.
- spark** Emit sparks of fire or electricity.
*A **spark** of decency.*
- sparkle** Be vivacious and witty.
*Her earrings **sparkled** as she turned her head.*
- tinder** Dry, flammable material, such as wood or paper, used for lighting a fire.
*They slashed down the undergrowth for **tinder**.*
- trigger** Release or pull the trigger on.
*An allergy can be **triggered** by stress or overwork.*
- twinkle** Smile so that one's eyes sparkle.
*The lights **twinkled** in the distance.*
- twinkling** Shining with a gleam that changes from bright to faint.
***Twinkling** eyes happy smiles.*
- wink** Signal by winking.
*The diamond on her finger **winked** in the moonlight.*
