aerated	Agitated, angry, or overexcited. <i>Don t get so aerated.</i>
bubbling	Containing bubbles or making a bubbling sound. <i>Flutes full of bubbling champagne.</i>
bubbly	Containing bubbles. <i>A bright and bubbly personality.</i>
carbonated	Having carbonation especially artificially carbonated.
effervescent	(of a liquid) giving off bubbles. <i>His fertile effervescent mind.</i>
fizzing	Hissing and bubbling.
fizzy	(of a drink) containing bubbles of gas; effervescent. <i>Fizzy new wave pop.</i>

foaming	Emitting or filled with bubbles as from carbonation or fermentation. <i>Pints of foaming bitter.</i>

gassy	Suffering from excessive gas in the alimentary canal. <i>A long and gassy book.</i>

fizz	The quality of being fizzy effervescence. <i>She saw I had lost some of my fizz.</i>

flickering	Shining unsteadily. <i>The flickering flames cast long shadows.</i>

glint	A momentary flash of light. <i>Her glasses glinted in the firelight.</i>
glisten	Be shiny, as if wet. <i>There was a glisten of perspiration across her top lip.</i>
<u>glistening</u>	Shining with a sparkling light. <i>Glistening bodies of swimmers.</i>
<u>glitter</u>	The occurrence of a small flash or spark. <i>The scathing glitter in his eyes.</i>
glow	Give out steady light without flame. <i>Make the people's hearts glow.</i>
<u>grin</u>	Express with a broad smile. <i>My word grinned the delighted man.</i>
<u>jewel</u>	A precious or semiprecious stone incorporated into a piece of jewelry. <i>Jeweled dresses.</i>
lustrous	Having lustre; shining. <i>Large lustrous eyes.</i>
moment	A quantity that expresses the average or expected value of the first second third or fourth power of the deviation of each component of a frequency distribution from a given value typically mean or zero The first moment is the mean the second moment the variance the third moment the skew and the fourth moment the kurtosis. <i>She is studying at the moment.</i>
polish	Improve or perfect by pruning or polishing. <i>They performed with great polish.</i>
rekindle	Revive (something lost or lapsed). <i>He tried to rekindle their friendship.</i>
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>My hair has lost its shine.</i>
shining	Marked by exceptional merit. <i>He has set a shining example with his model behaviour.</i>

<u>shiny</u>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i>Shiny black patents.</i>
spark	Emit sparks of fire or electricity. <i>A spark of decency.</i>
<u>sparkle</u>	Be vivacious and witty. <i>Her earrings sparkled as she turned her head.</i>
tinder	Dry, flammable material, such as wood or paper, used for lighting a fire. <i>They slashed down the undergrowth for tinder.</i>
trigger	Release or pull the trigger on. <i>An allergy can be triggered by stress or overwork.</i>
<u>twinkle</u>	Smile so that one's eyes sparkle. <i>The lights twinkled in the distance.</i>
<u>twinkling</u>	Shining with a gleam that changes from bright to faint. <i>Twinkling eyes happy smiles.</i>
<u>wink</u>	Signal by winking. <i>The diamond on her finger winked in the moonlight.</i>
