<b>foaming</b>	Emitting or filled with bubbles as from carbonation or fermentation. <i>Pints of <b>foaming</b> bitter.</i>
<b>frothy</b>	Light and entertaining but of little substance. <i>Lots of <b>frothy</b> interviews.</i>
<b>gassy</b>	Suffering from excessive gas in the alimentary canal. <i>A long and <b>gassy</b> book.</i>

<b>flickering</b>	Shining unsteadily. <i>The <b>flickering</b> flames cast long shadows.</i>
<b>froth</b>	Make froth or foam and become bubbly. <i>Leave the yeast until there is a good head of <b>froth</b>.</i>
<b>glimmer</b>	Shine faintly with a wavering light. <i>He saw a faint <b>glimmer</b> of light from her window.</i>
<b>glint</b>	A momentary flash of light. <i>Her glasses <b>glinted</b> in the firelight.</i>
<b>glisten</b>	Be shiny, as if wet. <i>There was a <b>glisten</b> of perspiration across her top lip.</i>
<b>glistening</b>	Shining with a sparkling light. <i><b>Glistening</b> bodies of swimmers.</i>
<b>glitter</b>	The occurrence of a small flash or spark. <i>The scathing <b>glitter</b> in his eyes.</i>
<b>glow</b>	Give out steady light without flame. <i>Make the people's hearts <b>glow</b>.</i>
<b>grin</b>	Express with a broad smile. <i>My word <b>grinned</b> the delighted man.</i>
<b>jewel</b>	A precious or semiprecious stone incorporated into a piece of jewelry. <i><b>Jeweled</b> dresses.</i>
<b>lustrous</b>	Having lustre; shining. <i>Large <b>lustrous</b> eyes.</i>
<b>moment</b>	A quantity that expresses the average or expected value of the first second third or fourth power of the deviation of each component of a frequency distribution from a given value typically mean or zero The first moment is the mean the second moment the variance the third moment the skew and the fourth moment the kurtosis. <i>She is studying at the <b>moment</b>.</i>
<b>polish</b>	Improve or perfect by pruning or polishing. <i>They performed with great <b>polish</b>.</i>
<b>rekindle</b>	Revive (something lost or lapsed). <i>He tried to <b>rekindle</b> their friendship.</i>
<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>My hair has lost its <b>shine</b>.</i>
<b>shining</b>	Marked by exceptional merit. <i>He has set a <b>shining</b> example with his model behaviour.</i>

<b>shiny</b>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i><b>Shiny</b> black patents.</i>
<b>spark</b>	Emit sparks of fire or electricity. <i>A <b>spark</b> of decency.</i>
<b>sparkle</b>	Be vivacious and witty. <i>Her earrings <b>sparkled</b> as she turned her head.</i>
<b>tinder</b>	Dry, flammable material, such as wood or paper, used for lighting a fire. <i>They slashed down the undergrowth for <b>tinder</b>.</i>
<b>trigger</b>	Release or pull the trigger on. <i>An allergy can be <b>triggered</b> by stress or overwork.</i>
<b>twinkle</b>	Smile so that one's eyes sparkle. <i>The lights <b>twinkled</b> in the distance.</i>
<b>twinkling</b>	Shining with a gleam that changes from bright to faint. <i><b>Twinkling</b> eyes happy smiles.</i>
<b>wink</b>	Signal by winking. <i>The diamond on her finger <b>winked</b> in the moonlight.</i>
