bore Cause to be bored.

incise Cut (skin or flesh) with a surgical instrument.

put a hole in Formulate in a particular style or language.

riddle Separate with a riddle as grain from chaff.

The bullets **riddle**d his body.

(especially of a pipe or container, or bodily part such as an organ or

skewer Drive a skewer through.

Politicians are used to being **skewer**ed.

slit Form one s eyes into slits squint.

Rain gently.

spit It began to spit.
