### Definitions of "Specialize" as a verb

- *Adapt or set apart (an organ or part) to serve a special function or to suit a particular way of life.*
- *Concentrate on and become expert in a particular subject or skill.*
- *Become more focus on an area of activity or field of study.*
- *Suit to a special purpose.*
- *Become more focused on an area of activity or field of study.*
- *Make a habit of engaging in a particular activity.*
- *Be specific about.*
- *Devote oneself to a special area of work.*
- *Confine oneself to providing a particular product or service.*

<b>economist</b>	An expert in the science of economics.
<b>expert</b>	A person with special knowledge or ability who performs skillfully. <i>An <b>expert</b> job.</i>
<b>grammarian</b>	A linguist who specializes in the study of grammar and syntax.
<b>guru</b>	A recognized leader in some field or of some movement. <i>A <b>guru</b> of genomics.</i>
<b>historian</b>	An expert in or student of history, especially that of a particular period, geographical region, or social phenomenon. <i>A military <b>historian</b>.</i>
<b>individuate</b>	Give individual character to. <i>Language that <b>individuates</b> his memories.</i>
<b>lapidary</b>	Relating to the engraving, cutting, or polishing of stones and gems. <i>A <b>lapidary</b> statement.</i>
<b>mathematician</b>	A person skilled in mathematics. <i>One of the world's foremost theoretical <b>mathematicians</b>.</i>
<b>metallurgical</b>	Of or relating to metallurgy. <i><b>Metallurgical</b> engineer.</i>
<b>numismatist</b>	A collector and student of money (and coins in particular).
<b>occupational</b>	Relating to a job or profession. <i>An <b>occupational</b> pension scheme.</i>
<b>professional</b>	Worthy of or appropriate to a professional person competent skilful or assured. <i>Their music is both memorable and <b>professional</b>.</i>
<b>pupil</b>	A young person attending school (up through senior high school). <i>Will you take me on as your <b>pupil</b>?</i>
<b>scholar</b>	A university student holding a scholarship. <i>Mr Bell declares himself no <b>scholar</b>.</i>
<b>schoolmaster</b>	An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to inexperienced riders or horses.
<b>specialist</b>	A person who concentrates primarily on a particular subject or activity; a person highly skilled in a specific and restricted field. <i>You may require <b>specialist</b> financial advice.</i>
<b>statistician</b>	An expert in the preparation and analysis of statistics.
<b>study</b>	Apply oneself to study. <i>He is meditating in his <b>study</b>.</i>

<b>taxonomist</b>	A biologist who specializes in the classification of organisms into groups on the basis of their structure and origin and behavior.
<b>training</b>	The action of teaching a person or animal a particular skill or type of behaviour. <i>In service <b>training</b> for staff.</i>
<b>tutelage</b>	Teaching pupils individually (usually by a tutor hired privately). <i>He felt privileged to be under the <b>tutelage</b> of an experienced actor.</i>
<b>tutor</b>	Work as a tutor. <i><b>Tutor</b> groups.</i>
<b>university</b>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at <b>university</b>.</i>
