## Definitions of "Specific" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "specific" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Applying to or characterized by or distinguishing something particular or special or unique.*
- *Clearly defined or identified.*
- *Stated explicitly or in detail.*
- *Relating to or distinguishing or constituting a taxonomic species.*
- *(of a duty or a tax) levied at a fixed rate per physical unit of the thing taxed, regardless of its price.*
- *Relating to species or a species.*
- *Of or denoting a number equal to the ratio of the value of some property of a given substance to the value of the same property of some other substance used as a reference, such as water, or of a vacuum, under equivalent conditions.*
- *Being or affecting a disease produced by a particular microorganism or condition; used also of stains or dyes used in making microscope slides.*
- *Belonging or relating uniquely to a particular subject.*
- *Of or denoting a physical quantity expressed in terms of a unit mass, volume, or other measure, in order to give a value independent of the properties or scale of the particular system studied.*
- *(sometimes followed by `to') applying to or characterized by or distinguishing something particular or special or unique.*
- *Precise and clear in making statements or issuing instructions.*

<b>distinct</b>	Clearly or sharply defined to the mind. <i>Plants of several <b>distinct</b> types.</i>
<b><u>exact</u></b>	(of a subject of study) permitting precise measurements as a basis for rigorously testable theories. <i>Psychomedicine isn t an <b>exact</b> science yet.</i>
<b><u>explicit</u></b>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>She made her wishes <b>explicit</b>.</i>
<b>express</b>	Not tacit or implied. <i>An <b>express</b> train.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Fixed and unmoving. <i>A <b>fixed</b> piece of wood.</i>
<b>individual</b>	Being or characteristic of a single thing or person. <i>She creates her own highly <b>individual</b> landscapes.</i>
<b><u>meticulous</u></b>	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. <i>A <b>meticulous</b> craftsman.</i>
<b>particular</b>	Separate and distinct from others of the same group or category. <i>A man who wishes to make a <b>particular</b> woman fall in love with him.</i>
<b>peculiar</b>	Belonging exclusively to. <i>Stella thought the play <b>peculiar</b>.</i>

<b>pinpoint</b>	Tiny. <i>This weapon fired shells with <b>pinpoint</b> accuracy.</i>
<b><u>precise</u></b>	Used to emphasize that one is referring to an exact and particular thing. <i><b>Precise</b> directions.</i>
<b>separate</b>	Separated according to race sex class or religion. <i>Melt the white and plain chocolate in <b>separate</b> bowls.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set down according to a plan. <i>The time <b>set</b> for the launching.</i>
<b><u>single</u></b>	Being or characteristic of a single thing or person. <i>The kingdom was ruled over by a <b>single</b> family.</i>
<b>specified</b>	Clearly and explicitly stated. <i>Meals are at <b>specified</b> times.</i>
<b>strict</b>	Characterized by strictness severity or restraint. <i>A <b>strict</b> upbringing.</i>
<b><u>unambiguous</u></b>	Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion. <i>As a horror apartheid is absolutely <b>unambiguous</b>.</i>
<b><u>unequivocal</u></b>	Leaving no doubt; unambiguous. <i><b>Unequivocal</b> evidence.</i>
<b>well defined</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

<b>nicety</b>	Conformity with some esthetic standard of correctness or propriety. <i>She prided herself on her <b>nicety</b> of pronunciation.</i>
<b>particular</b>	A proposition that asserts something about some (but not all) members of a class. <i>Universals can be simultaneously exemplified by different <b>particulars</b> in different places.</i>
<b><u>particularly</u></b>	Used to single out a subject to which a statement is especially applicable. <i>He was <b>particularly</b> fussy about spelling.</i>
