adapted	Changed in order to improve or made more fit for a particular purpose. Seeds precisely <b>adapted</b> to the area.
<u>apparent</u>	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. It became <b>apparent</b> that he was talented.
<u>blatant</u>	(of bad behaviour) done openly and unashamedly. Incredibly <b>blatant</b> product placement.
clearly	In an intelligible manner. <b>Clearly</b> things have changed in the last six weeks.
<u>conspicuous</u>	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. A tower <b>conspicuous</b> at a great distance.
defined	Having a definite outline or specification; precisely marked or stated. Lost in a maze of words both <b>defined</b> and un <b>defined</b> .
dispensation	An exemption from some rule or obligation. The Pope granted Henry a <b>dispensation</b> to marry Elizabeth of York.
distinct	Clearly or sharply defined to the mind. <i>Distinct</i> fingerprints.
egregious	Outstandingly bad; shocking. <i>Egregious</i> abuses of copyright.
especial	For or belonging chiefly to one person or thing. These traditions are of <b>especial</b> interest to feminists.
especially	Used to single out one person or thing over all others. An <b>especially</b> or specially cautious approach to the danger.
exceptionally	Only in unusual circumstances. The court allows half an hour in most cases one hour <b>exceptionally</b> for a very important case.



featured	(of a newspaper or magazine article, broadcast programme, or show) made a special attraction. My aunt was a tall hard <b>featured</b> lady.
flagrant	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>Flagrant</i> violation of human rights.
insofar	To the degree or extent that. <b>Insofar</b> as it can be ascertained the horse lung is comparable to that of man.
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. Well <b>marked</b> roads.
notably	Especially; in particular. Such a statement is <b>notably</b> absent from the government s proposals.
noticed	Being perceived or observed. An easily <b>noticed</b> effect on the rate of growth.
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. It was an <b>obvious</b> remark to make.
particular	A fact about some part (as opposed to general. Interested in one <b>particular</b> artist.
<u>particularly</u>	Used to single out a subject to which a statement is especially applicable. <i>He was <b>particularly</b> fussy about spelling.</i>
pronounced	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. <i>He had a <b>pronounced</b> squint.</i>
selected	Chosen in preference to another.
singularly	In a remarkable or noticeable way. A <b>singularly</b> unattractive colour.
special	Used to denote education for children with particular needs especially those with learning difficulties. <i>A special reason to confide in her.</i>
<u>specially</u>	For a special purpose. An e <b>specially</b> or <b>specially</b> cautious approach to the danger.
<u>specific</u>	A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease. <i>Specific conductance.</i>
specificity	The quality of being specific to a particular organism. The sensitivity of paramedics for diagnosis of stroke was 66 with a <b>specificity</b> of 98.
<u>tailored</u>	Severely simple in line or design. A <b>tailored</b> charcoal grey suit.

Adjust the balance of a ship or aircraft by rearranging its cargo or by means of its trim tabs.

Refinements such as air conditioning and leather **trim**.
