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Associations of "Specifically" (30 Words)

adapted	Changed in order to improve or made more fit for a particular purpose. <i>Seeds precisely adapted to the area.</i>
apparent	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>It became apparent that he was talented.</i>
blatant	(of bad behaviour) done openly and unashamedly. <i>Incredibly blatant product placement.</i>
clearly	In an intelligible manner. <i>Clearly things have changed in the last six weeks.</i>
conspicuous	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. <i>A tower conspicuous at a great distance.</i>
defined	Having a definite outline or specification; precisely marked or stated. <i>Lost in a maze of words both defined and undefined.</i>
dispensation	An exemption from some rule or obligation. <i>The Pope granted Henry a dispensation to marry Elizabeth of York.</i>
distinct	Clearly or sharply defined to the mind. <i>Distinct fingerprints.</i>
egregious	Outstandingly bad; shocking. <i>Egregious abuses of copyright.</i>
especial	For or belonging chiefly to one person or thing. <i>These traditions are of especial interest to feminists.</i>
especially	Used to single out one person or thing over all others. <i>An especially or specially cautious approach to the danger.</i>
exceptionally	Only in unusual circumstances. <i>The court allows half an hour in most cases one hour exceptionally for a very important case.</i>

featured	(of a newspaper or magazine article, broadcast programme, or show) made a special attraction. <i>My aunt was a tall hard featured lady.</i>
flagrant	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>Flagrant violation of human rights.</i>
insofar	To the degree or extent that. <i>Insofar as it can be ascertained the horse lung is comparable to that of man.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>Well marked roads.</i>
<u>notably</u>	Especially; in particular. <i>Such a statement is notably absent from the government s proposals.</i>
noticed	Being perceived or observed. <i>An easily noticed effect on the rate of growth.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was an obvious remark to make.</i>
particular	A fact about some part (as opposed to general). <i>Interested in one particular artist.</i>
<u>particularly</u>	Used to single out a subject to which a statement is especially applicable. <i>He was particularly fussy about spelling.</i>
pronounced	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. <i>He had a pronounced squint.</i>
selected	Chosen in preference to another.
singularly	In a remarkable or noticeable way. <i>A singularly unattractive colour.</i>
special	Used to denote education for children with particular needs especially those with learning difficulties. <i>A special reason to confide in her.</i>
<u>specially</u>	For a special purpose. <i>An especially or specially cautious approach to the danger.</i>
<u>specific</u>	A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease. <i>Specific conductance.</i>
specificity	The quality of being specific to a particular organism. <i>The sensitivity of paramedics for diagnosis of stroke was 66 with a specificity of 98.</i>
<u>tailored</u>	Severely simple in line or design. <i>A tailored charcoal grey suit.</i>

trim

Adjust the balance of a ship or aircraft by rearranging its cargo or by means of its trim tabs.

*Refinements such as air conditioning and leather **trim**.*
