| <b><u>blatant</u></b>     | (of bad behaviour) done openly and unashamedly.<br><i>Incredibly <b>blatant</b> product placement.</i>  |
| <b>clearly</b>            | In an intelligible manner.<br><i><b>Clearly</b> things have changed in the last six weeks.</i>  |

| <b>defined</b>            | Having a definite outline or specification; precisely marked or stated.<br><i>Lost in a maze of words both <b>defined</b> and <b>undefined</b>.</i> |
| <b>dispensation</b>       | An exemption from some rule or obligation.<br><i>The Pope granted Henry a <b>dispensation</b> to marry Elizabeth of York.</i>                       |
| <b>distinct</b>           | Clearly or sharply defined to the mind.<br><i><b>Distinct</b> fingerprints.</i>   |
| <b>egregious</b>          | Outstandingly bad; shocking.<br><i><b>Egregious</b> abuses of copyright.</i>  |
| <b>especial</b>           | For or belonging chiefly to one person or thing.<br><i>These traditions are of <b>especial</b> interest to feminists.</i>                           |
| <b>especially</b>         | Used to single out one person or thing over all others.<br><i>An <b>especially</b> or specially cautious approach to the danger.</i>                |
| <b>exceptionally</b>      | Only in unusual circumstances.<br><i>The court allows half an hour in most cases one hour <b>exceptionally</b> for a very important case.</i>       |

| <b>featured</b>     | (of a newspaper or magazine article, broadcast programme, or show) made a special attraction.<br><i>My aunt was a tall hard <b>featured</b> lady.</i>           |
| <b>flagrant</b>     | Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible.<br><i><b>Flagrant</b> violation of human rights.</i>   |
| <b>insofar</b>      | To the degree or extent that.<br><i><b>Insofar</b> as it can be ascertained the horse lung is comparable to that of man.</i>                                    |
| <b>marked</b>       | Strongly marked easily noticeable.<br><i>Well <b>marked</b> roads.</i>  |
| <b>notably</b>      | Especially; in particular.<br><i>Such a statement is <b>notably</b> absent from the government s proposals.</i>   |
| <b>noticed</b>      | Being perceived or observed.<br><i>An easily <b>noticed</b> effect on the rate of growth.</i>   |
| <b>obvious</b>      | Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind.<br><i>It was an <b>obvious</b> remark to make.</i>   |
| <b>particular</b>   | A fact about some part (as opposed to general).<br><i>Interested in one <b>particular</b> artist.</i>   |
| <b>particularly</b> | Used to single out a subject to which a statement is especially applicable.<br><i>He was <b>particularly</b> fussy about spelling.</i>                          |
| <b>pronounced</b>   | Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous.<br><i>He had a <b>pronounced</b> squint.</i>  |
| <b>selected</b>     | Chosen in preference to another.  |
| <b>singularly</b>   | In a remarkable or noticeable way.<br><i>A <b>singularly</b> unattractive colour.</i>   |
| <b>special</b>      | Used to denote education for children with particular needs especially those with learning difficulties.<br><i>A <b>special</b> reason to confide in her.</i>   |
| <b>specially</b>    | For a special purpose.<br><i>An <b>especially</b> or <b>specially</b> cautious approach to the danger.</i>  |
| <b>specific</b>     | A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease.<br><i><b>Specific</b> conductance.</i>   |
| <b>specificity</b>  | The quality of being specific to a particular organism.<br><i>The sensitivity of paramedics for diagnosis of stroke was 66 with a <b>specificity</b> of 98.</i> |
| <b>tailored</b>     | Severely simple in line or design.<br><i>A <b>tailored</b> charcoal grey suit.</i>  |
