

### Specimen as a Noun

#### Definitions of "Specimen" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "specimen" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- An example regarded as typical of its class.
- An individual animal, plant, piece of a mineral, etc. used as an example of its species or type for scientific study or display.
- A bit of tissue or blood or urine that is taken for diagnostic purposes.
- Used to refer humorously to a person or animal.
- An example of something regarded as typical of its class or group.
- A sample for medical testing, especially of urine.





## Synonyms of "Specimen" as a noun (10 Words)

bit	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. A <b>bit</b> of rock caught him in the eye.
demonstration	A practical exhibition and explanation of how something works or is performed. The lecture was accompanied by dramatic <b>demonstrations</b> .
example	A task performed or problem solved in order to develop skill or understanding. <i>He followed his brother s <b>example</b> and deserted his family.</i>
exemplification	Showing by example.
illustration	Artwork that helps make something clear or attractive. By way of <b>illustration</b> I refer to the following case.
<u>instance</u>	An item of information that is typical of a class or group. In this <b>instance</b> it mattered little.
representative piece	An item of information that is typical of a class or group.
<u>sample</u>	A small amount of a food or other commodity, especially one given to a prospective customer. A simple random <b>sample</b> of forty five students.
selection	A plot of land acquired by selection. Some local Tories objected to his <b>selection</b> .
snippet	A small piece or brief extract. <b>Snippet</b> s of information about the war.





#### Usage Examples of "Specimen" as a noun

- They collected a urine specimen for urinalysis.
- A specimen paper of the new test.
- Specimens of copper ore.
- Carla could not help feeling a degree of reluctant admiration for this odd female specimen.

<u>archetype</u>	An original which has been imitated; a prototype. Mythological <b>archetype</b> s of good and evil.
case	An agreed summary of the facts relating to a legal case drawn up for review or decision on a point of law by a higher court. <i>A mental case</i> .
emulation	Technique of one machine obtaining the same results as another. Software <b>emulation</b> of complete systems.
<u>epitome</u>	A summary of a written work; an abstract. She looked the <b>epitome</b> of elegance and good taste.
established	Brought about or set up or accepted especially long established. The <b>established</b> Church.
example	Something to be imitated. But there is always the famous <b>example</b> of the Smiths.



<u>exemplar</u>	Something to be imitated. An <b>exemplar</b> of success.
formation	A thing that has been formed. A <b>formation</b> of planes.
herbarium	A room or building housing a herbarium.
ideal	Conforming to an ultimate standard of perfection or excellence embodying an ideal. In an <b>ideal</b> world we might have made a different decision.
illustration	Artwork that helps make something clear or attractive. This accident is a graphic <b>illustration</b> of the disaster that s waiting to happen.
<u>instance</u>	An occurrence of something. Another <b>instance</b> occurred yesterday.
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>The lattice</i> of branches above her.
mannequin	A life-size dummy used to display clothes. <i>She was too fat to be a mannequin</i> .
<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>Society s paradigm</i> of the ideal woman.
paradigmatic	Serving as a typical example of something. <i>His biography is <b>paradigmatic</b> of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<u>paragon</u>	A perfect diamond of 100 carats or more. It would have taken a <b>paragon</b> of virtue not to feel viciously jealous.
<u>photogenic</u>	(of an organism or tissue) producing or emitting light. A <b>photogenic</b> child.
prototype	Make a prototype of a product. <i>He is the <b>prototype</b> of good breeding.</i>
<u>proven</u>	(of a new method, system, or treatment) tried and tested. A <b>proven</b> risk to health.
<u>replica</u>	An exact copy or model of something, especially one on a smaller scale. It is a <b>replica</b> of an antique plaque.
<u>sample</u>	Take a sample of. <i>Samples of products for evaluation.</i>
scientifically	In a way that relates to or is used in science. Both theories can be explained <b>scientifically</b> .



spheroid	A solid generated by a half revolution of an ellipse about its major axis prolate spheroid or minor axis oblate spheroid. It looked like a sphere but on closer examination I saw it was really a <b>spheroid</b> .
stereotype	Treat or classify according to a mental stereotype. I was <b>stereotype</b> d as a lazy Southern European.
<u>tested</u>	Tested and proved useful or correct. A <b>tested</b> method.
triplicate	A thing which is part of a set of three copies or corresponding parts. <i>Triplicate</i> the letter for the committee.
type	Metal types used in letterpress printing. She characterized his witty sayings as the <b>type</b> of modern wisdom.
typify	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.
verified	Proved to be true. A <b>verified</b> claim.
