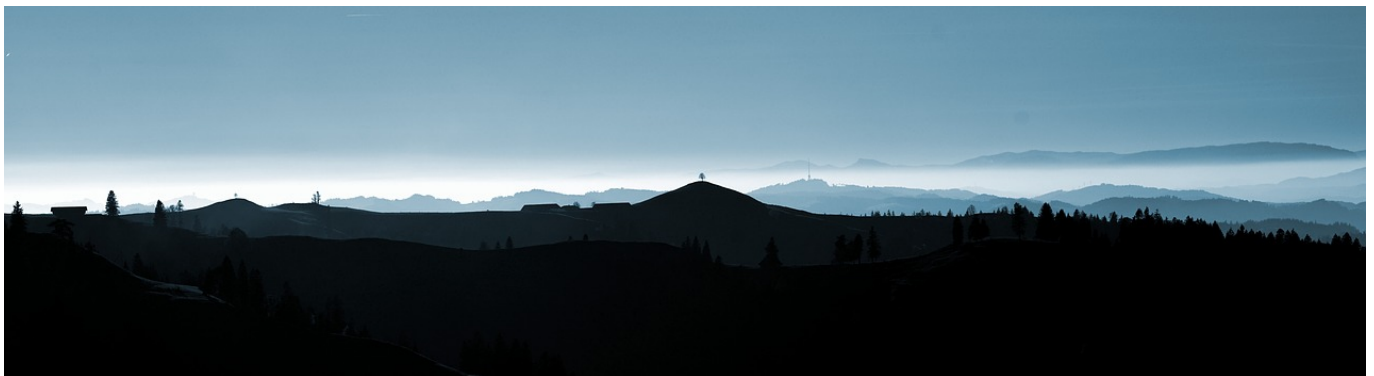

### Definitions of "Specimen" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “specimen” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An example regarded as typical of its class.*
- *An individual animal, plant, piece of a mineral, etc. used as an example of its species or type for scientific study or display.*
- *A bit of tissue or blood or urine that is taken for diagnostic purposes.*
- *Used to refer humorously to a person or animal.*
- *An example of something regarded as typical of its class or group.*
- *A sample for medical testing, especially of urine.*



## Synonyms of "Specimen" as a noun (10 Words)

<b>bit</b>	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>A <b>bit</b> of rock caught him in the eye.</i>
<b>demonstration</b>	A practical exhibition and explanation of how something works or is performed. <i>The lecture was accompanied by dramatic <b>demonstrations</b>.</i>
<b>example</b>	A task performed or problem solved in order to develop skill or understanding. <i>He followed his brother s <b>example</b> and deserted his family.</i>
<b>exemplification</b>	Showing by example.
<b>illustration</b>	Artwork that helps make something clear or attractive. <i>By way of <b>illustration</b> I refer to the following case.</i>
<a href="#"><u>instance</u></a>	An item of information that is typical of a class or group. <i>In this <b>instance</b> it mattered little.</i>
<b>representative piece</b>	An item of information that is typical of a class or group.
<a href="#"><u>sample</u></a>	A small amount of a food or other commodity, especially one given to a prospective customer. <i>A simple random <b>sample</b> of forty five students.</i>
<b>selection</b>	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>Some local Tories objected to his <b>selection</b>.</i>
<b>snippet</b>	A small piece or brief extract. <i><b>Snippets</b> of information about the war.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Specimen" as a noun

- *Specimens of copper ore.*
- *Carla could not help feeling a degree of reluctant admiration for this odd female specimen.*

<b>case</b>	An agreed summary of the facts relating to a legal case drawn up for review or decision on a point of law by a higher court. <i>A mental <b>case</b>.</i>
<b>emulation</b>	Technique of one machine obtaining the same results as another. <i>Software <b>emulation</b> of complete systems.</i>
<b><u>epitome</u></b>	A summary of a written work; an abstract. <i>She looked the <b>epitome</b> of elegance and good taste.</i>

<b><u>exemplar</u></b>	Something to be imitated. <i>An <b>exemplar</b> of success.</i>
<b>formation</b>	A thing that has been formed. <i>A <b>formation</b> of planes.</i>
<b>herbarium</b>	A room or building housing a herbarium.
<b>ideal</b>	Conforming to an ultimate standard of perfection or excellence embodying an ideal. <i>In an <b>ideal</b> world we might have made a different decision.</i>
<b>illustration</b>	Artwork that helps make something clear or attractive. <i>This accident is a graphic <b>illustration</b> of the disaster that s waiting to happen.</i>
<b><u>instance</u></b>	An occurrence of something. <i>Another <b>instance</b> occurred yesterday.</i>
<b>lattice</b>	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>The <b>lattice</b> of branches above her.</i>
<b>mannequin</b>	A life-size dummy used to display clothes. <i>She was too fat to be a <b>mannequin</b>.</i>
<b><u>paradigm</u></b>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>Society s <b>paradigm</b> of the ideal woman.</i>
<b>paradigmatic</b>	Serving as a typical example of something. <i>His biography is <b>paradigmatic</b> of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<b><u>paragon</u></b>	A perfect diamond of 100 carats or more. <i>It would have taken a <b>paragon</b> of virtue not to feel viciously jealous.</i>
<b><u>photogenic</u></b>	(of an organism or tissue) producing or emitting light. <i>A <b>photogenic</b> child.</i>
<b>prototype</b>	Make a prototype of a product. <i>He is the <b>prototype</b> of good breeding.</i>
<b><u>proven</u></b>	(of a new method, system, or treatment) tried and tested. <i>A <b>proven</b> risk to health.</i>
<b><u>replica</u></b>	An exact copy or model of something, especially one on a smaller scale. <i>It is a <b>replica</b> of an antique plaque.</i>
<b><u>sample</u></b>	Take a sample of. <i><b>Samples</b> of products for evaluation.</i>
<b>scientifically</b>	In a way that relates to or is used in science. <i>Both theories can be explained <b>scientifically</b>.</i>

<b>spheroid</b>	A solid generated by a half revolution of an ellipse about its major axis prolate spheroid or minor axis oblate spheroid. <i>It looked like a sphere but on closer examination I saw it was really a <b>spheroid</b>.</i>
<b>stereotype</b>	Treat or classify according to a mental stereotype. <i>I was <b>stereotyped</b> as a lazy Southern European.</i>
<b>tested</b>	Tested and proved useful or correct. <i>A <b>tested</b> method.</i>
<b>triplicate</b>	A thing which is part of a set of three copies or corresponding parts. <i><b>Triplicate</b> the letter for the committee.</i>
<b>type</b>	Metal types used in letterpress printing. <i>She characterized his witty sayings as the <b>type</b> of modern wisdom.</i>
<b>typify</b>	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.</i>
<b>verified</b>	Proved to be true. <i>A <b>verified</b> claim.</i>
