### Definitions of "Spectator" as a noun

- *A close observer; someone who looks at something (such as an exhibition of some kind).*
- *A person who watches at a show, game, or other event.*
- *A woman's pump with medium heel; usually in contrasting colors for toe and heel.*



## Synonyms of "Spectator" as a noun (12 Words)

<b><u>bystander</u></b>	A person who is present at an event or incident but does not take part. <i>Water cannons were turned on marchers and innocent <b>bystanders</b> alike.</i>
<b>eyewitness</b>	A spectator who can describe what happened. <i><b>Eyewitness</b> accounts of the London blitz.</i>
<b>fly on the wall</b>	A hit that flies up in the air.
<b>looker</b>	A very attractive or seductive looking woman. <i>It depends on whether you are a listener a <b>looker</b> or a doer.</i>
<b>looker-on</b>	Someone who looks on.
<b>observer</b>	A person trained to spot and identify enemy aircraft or to reconnoitre enemy positions from the air. <i>He had been invited to attend the meeting as an <b>observer</b>.</i>
<b>onlooker</b>	A non-participating observer; a spectator. <i>A crowd of fascinated <b>onlookers</b>.</i>

<b>sightseer</b>	A person who goes sightseeing. <i>Hordes of <b>sightseers</b>.</i>
<b>spectator pump</b>	A woman's pump with medium heel; usually in contrasting colors for toe and heel.
<b>viewer</b>	A device for looking at film transparencies or similar photographic images. <i>Our presenters are role models for young <b>viewers</b>.</i>
<b>watcher</b>	A close observer; someone who looks at something (such as an exhibition of some kind). <i>Sky <b>watchers</b> discovered a new star.</i>
<b>witness</b>	Testimony by word or deed to your religious faith. <i>The memorial service was <b>witness</b> to the wide circle of his interests.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Spectator" as a noun

- *The spectators applauded the performance.*
- *Around fifteen thousand spectators came to watch the thrills and spills.*





## Associations of "Spectator" (30 Words)

- attendant** An assistant to an important person; a servant or courtier.  
*A mosaic of the Empress Theodora with her **attendants**.*
- attendee** A person who attends a conference or other gathering.  
*The gathering satisfied both organizers and **attendees**.*
- beholder** A person who sees or observes someone or something.  
*The building and landscape can elicit imaginative responses from the **beholder**.*
- concourse** The action of coming together or meeting.  
*A station **concourse**.*
- contestant** A person who takes part in a contest or competition.  
*An anxious **contestant** on a television quiz show.*
- crowd** Cause to herd drive or crowd together.  
*A **crowd** of insects assembled around the flowers.*

<b>crystallized</b>	Having both internal structure and external form of a crystal. <i>She didn't have any <b>crystallized</b> plans for her career path after graduation.</i>
<b>enclosure</b>	A barrier that surrounds an area. <i>The members <b>enclosure</b>.</i>
<b>experimenter</b>	A research worker who conducts experiments. <i>Each participant was tested by a trained <b>experimenter</b>.</i>
<b>floodlight</b>	The illumination provided by a floodlight. <i>A tennis court where you can play by <b>floodlight</b>.</i>
<b>grandstand</b>	Of a view seen from an advantageous position as if from a grandstand. <i>She never misses a chance to <b>grandstand</b>.</i>
<b>hide-and-seek</b>	Go to or towards.
<b>jam</b>	A hold obtained by jamming a part of the body such as a hand or foot into a crack in the rock. <i>Paper <b>jams</b>.</i>
<b>mob</b>	A loose affiliation of gangsters in charge of organized criminal activities. <i>He was <b>mobbed</b> by autograph hunters.</i>
<b>multitude</b>	A large gathering of people. <i>A <b>multitude</b> of medical conditions are due to being overweight.</i>
<b>observer</b>	A person who attends a conference, inquiry, etc., to note the proceedings without participating in them. <i>Elections scrutinized by international <b>observers</b>.</i>
<b>offstage</b>	Concealed from public view or attention. <i><b>Offstage</b> political meetings.</i>
<b>onlooker</b>	Someone who looks on. <i>A crowd of fascinated <b>onlookers</b>.</i>
<b>overcrowd</b>	Cause to crowd together too much. <i>Try not to <b>overcrowd</b> the leaflet with text.</i>
<b>paddock</b>	Keep a horse in a paddock. <i>The sheep have returned to their previously grazed <b>paddocks</b>.</i>
<b>partaker</b>	Someone who has or gives or receives a part or a share. <i>To be <b>partakers</b> of the divine nature means we become more Godlike.</i>
<b>participant</b>	A person who takes part in something. <i>Staff are to be active <b>participants</b> in the decision making process.</i>
<b>player</b>	Someone who plays a musical instrument (as a profession). <i>An MP3 <b>player</b>.</i>
<b>racetrack</b>	A track for motor racing.
