apparition A remarkable or unexpected appearance of someone or something.

A headless **apparition**.

A visible mass of water or ice particles suspended at a considerable altitude.

A black **cloud** hung over their lives.

fantasm A ghostly appearing figure.

An apparition of a dead person which is believed to appear or become

ghost manifest to the living, typically as a nebulous image.

He looked like he had seen a **ahost**.

An instance of a wrong or misinterpreted perception of a sensory experience.

illusion Stripes embellish the surface to create the **illusion** of various wood grain

textures.

Something that is a source of danger.

A new initiative aimed at beating the **menace** of drugs.

phantasm An illusion, apparition, or ghost.

The cart seemed to glide like a terrible **phantasm**.

phantasma Something existing in perception only.

A figment of the imagination.

phantomThe women suffered from **phantom** pain that no physician could ever find.



presence A group of people, especially soldiers or police, stationed in a particular place.

My presence in the flat made her happy.

shade A lampshade.

This area will be in **shade** for much of the day.

shadow Refuge from danger or observation. *A shadow* crossed Maria s face.

specter A mental representation of some haunting experience.

It aroused **specter**s from his past.

The real meaning or the intention behind something as opposed to its strict

spirit verbal interpretation.

I hope the team will build on this **spirit** of confidence.

threat A person or thing likely to cause damage or danger.

Members of her family have received death **threat**s.

vision The images seen on a television screen.

She had defective **vision**.

wraith A wisp or faint trace of something.

A sea breeze was sending a grey **wraith** of smoke up the slopes.
