Definitions of "Speechless" as an adjective

- Unable to speak, especially as the temporary result of shock or strong emotion.





Synonyms of "Speechless" as an adjective (7 Words)

dumb (of a person) unable to speak, most typically because of congenital deafness.

Dumb officials make some really **dumb** decisions.

silent Implied by or inferred from actions or statements.

She fell **silent** for a moment.

(of a gene) not appearing in a phenotype.

unexpressed Shortness is a recessive or unexpressed characteristic of Mendel s pea

plants.

unsaid Not made explicit.

Things left **unsaid**.

unspoken Expressed without speech.

Some kind of **unspoken** agreement.

unvoiced (of a speech sound) uttered without vibration of the vocal cords.

A person s **unvoiced** thoughts.



wordless

Not speaking or involving speech. Choking exasperation and **wordless** shame.



Usage Examples of "Speechless" as an adjective

- Speechless with shock.
- ullet He was speechless with rage.

ignorance Lack of knowledge or information.

He acted in **ignorance** of basic procedures.

Implied though not directly expressed; inherent in the nature of

<u>implicit</u> something.

The oak is **implicit** in the acorn.

inarticulate Not clearly expressed or pronounced.

An **inarticulate** cry.

inaudible Impossible to hear; imperceptible by the ear.

Inaudible pulses of high frequency sound.

incommunicado Without the means or right to communicate.

A prisoner held incommunicado.

Muffle the sound of a musical instrument especially by the use of a

mute mute.

The great church was **mute** and dark.

quietBecome quiet or quieter.

He understood her wish for peace and **quiet**.

With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard

quietly variant for quietly.

She was **quietly** confident that they d win.

Unable to speak because of hereditary deafness.

She fell **silent** for a moment.

The quality of being stupid or unintelligent.

A comedy of infantile **stupidity**.

sucker Of a plant produce suckers.

The **sucker**s run along each tentacle.

Implied by or inferred from actions or statements.

Your silence may be taken to mean **tacit** agreement.

Habitually reserved and uncommunicative.

After such gatherings she would be **taciturn** and morose.



wordless

uncharacteristically In uncharacteristic manner.

She seemed uncharacteristically quiet.

Unwilling to talk or impart information. uncommunicative

The **uncommunicative** Emily disappeared.

Not obtrusive or undesirably noticeable. unobtrusive

A quiet **unobtrusive** life of self denial.

Very difficult to pronounce correctly. unutterable

Unutterable contempt.

Relating to or designed for or using the singing voice. vocal

A vocal assembly.

Withdrawn from society seeking solitude. withdrawn

When her husband died she became very withdrawn.

Expressed without speech.

Choking exasperation and wordless shame.
