<a href="#">accelerate</a>	Move faster. <i>He <b>accelerated</b> the car.</i>
ascend	Slope upwards. <i>Carolyn s voice had <b>ascended</b> into high pitched giggles.</i>
ascending	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>The <b>ascending</b> stems of chickweed.</i>
celerity	A rate that is rapid.
<a href="#">climb</a>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>The rate of <b>climb</b> can be set by the pilot.</i>
climber	A person or animal that climbs. <i>The lead <b>climber</b> looked strong still but his partner often slumped in his ropes.</i>
elevator	The airfoil on the tailplane of an aircraft that makes it ascend or descend. <i>First you trim the rudder then the ailerons and finally the <b>elevator</b>.</i>
expedite	Process fast and efficiently. <i>This should <b>expedite</b> the process.</i>
fast	(of a surface) allowing or producing high-speed movement. <i><b>Fast</b> women.</i>
fastness	A strongly fortified defensive structure. <i>The dyes differ in their <b>fastness</b> to light.</i>
<a href="#">haste</a>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>In his <b>haste</b> to leave he forgot his book.</i>
hasten	Speed up the progress of; facilitate. <i>This tragedy probably <b>hastened</b> his own death from heart disease.</i>
hurry	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i><b>Hurry</b> up and finish your meal.</i>

<b>increase</b>	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The amount of work <b>increased</b>.</i>
<b>mountaineer</b>	A person who takes part in mountaineering.
<b>pace</b>	Regulate or set the pace of. <i>The horse <b>paced</b>.</i>
<b>precipitate</b>	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>Cell proteins were then <b>precipitated</b> and washed in 10 trichloroacetic acid.</i>
<b>quicken</b>	Make or become faster or quicker. <i>On the third day after his death the human body of Jesus was <b>quicken</b>ed by the Spirit.</i>
<b>quickness</b>	A rate that is rapid. <i>His <b>quickness</b> of mind gained him the respect of all parties.</i>
<b>rapidity</b>	A rate that is rapid. <i>Technology spreads with extraordinary <b>rapidity</b>.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise to one s feet. <i>The <b>rise</b> and fall of his voice.</i>
<b>risen</b>	Above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rush</b>	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. <i>Come back after the <b>rush</b>.</i>
<b>soar</b>	Increase rapidly above the usual level. <i>The dollar <b>soared</b> against the yen.</i>
<b>stronghold</b>	A place where a particular cause or belief is strongly defended or upheld. <i>Their mountain <b>strongholds</b> fell to enemy attack.</i>
<b>surge</b>	A sudden or abrupt strong increase. <i>Flooding caused by tidal <b>surges</b>.</i>
<b>swiftness</b>	Lack of delay; promptness. <i>Kay had the upper hand with her agility and <b>swiftness</b>.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Extending or moving toward a higher place. <i>From childhood <b>upward</b>.</i>
<b>velocity</b>	The rate at which money changes hands within an economy. <i>The tank shot backwards at an incredible <b>velocity</b>.</i>
<b>zoom</b>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The value of these stocks is <b>zooming</b>.</i>
