accelerate	Move faster. <i>He accelerated the car.</i>
ascend	Slope upwards. <i>Carolyn s voice had ascended into high pitched giggles.</i>
ascending	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>The ascending stems of chickweed.</i>
celerity	A rate that is rapid.
climb	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>The rate of climb can be set by the pilot.</i>

expedite	Process fast and efficiently. <i>This should expedite the process.</i>
fast	(of a surface) allowing or producing high-speed movement. <i>Fast women.</i>
fastness	A strongly fortified defensive structure. <i>The dyes differ in their fastness to light.</i>
haste	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>In his haste to leave he forgot his book.</i>
hasten	Speed up the progress of; facilitate. <i>This tragedy probably hastened his own death from heart disease.</i>
hurry	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>Hurry up and finish your meal.</i>

increase	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The amount of work increased.</i>
mountaineer	A person who takes part in mountaineering.
pace	Regulate or set the pace of. <i>The horse paced.</i>
precipitate	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>Cell proteins were then precipitated and washed in 10 trichloroacetic acid.</i>
quicken	Make or become faster or quicker. <i>On the third day after his death the human body of Jesus was quickened by the Spirit.</i>
quickness	A rate that is rapid. <i>His quickness of mind gained him the respect of all parties.</i>
rapidity	A rate that is rapid. <i>Technology spreads with extraordinary rapidity.</i>
rise	Rise to one s feet. <i>The rise and fall of his voice.</i>
risen	Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rush	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. <i>Come back after the rush.</i>
soar	Increase rapidly above the usual level. <i>The dollar soared against the yen.</i>
stronghold	A place where a particular cause or belief is strongly defended or upheld. <i>Their mountain strongholds fell to enemy attack.</i>
surge	A sudden or abrupt strong increase. <i>Flooding caused by tidal surges.</i>
swiftness	Lack of delay; promptness. <i>Kay had the upper hand with her agility and swiftness.</i>
upward	Extending or moving toward a higher place. <i>From childhood upward.</i>
velocity	The rate at which money changes hands within an economy. <i>The tank shot backwards at an incredible velocity.</i>
zoom	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The value of these stocks is zooming.</i>
