<b>brisk</b>	Quick and energetic. <i>She adopted a <b>brisk</b> businesslike tone.</i>
<b>expeditious</b>	Marked by speed and efficiency. <i>An <b>expeditious</b> investigation.</i>
<b>express</b>	Not tacit or implied. <i>Her <b>express</b> wish.</i>
<b>fast</b>	Engaging in or involving activities characterized by excitement, extranvagance, and risk-taking. <i>The <b>fast</b> life she led in London.</i>
<b>high-speed</b>	Operating at high speed.
<b>immediate</b>	Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect. <i>His <b>immediate</b> superior in the department.</i>
<b>prompt</b>	According to schedule or without delay; on time. <i>She would have died but for the <b>prompt</b> action of two ambulancemen.</i>
<b>quick</b>	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>He was always <b>quick</b> to point out her faults.</i>
<b>rapid</b>	Happening in a short time or at a great rate. <i>The country s <b>rapid</b> economic decline.</i>
<b>sharp</b>	Of a key having a sharp or sharps in the signature. <i>C <b>sharp</b>.</i>
<b>swift</b>	Moving very fast. <i>The <b>swiftest</b> horse in his stable.</i>
<b>unhesitating</b>	Characterized by quickness and firmness. <i>His reply was <b>unhesitating</b>.</i>

<b>abrupt</b>	Steep; precipitous. <i>An <b>abrupt</b> change in the weather.</i>
<b>acceleration</b>	The act of accelerating; increasing the speed. <i>The three litre model has spectacular <b>acceleration</b>.</i>
<b>airspeed</b>	The speed of an aircraft relative to the air through which it is moving.
<b>briskness</b>	Liveliness and eagerness.
<b>fastness</b>	The quality of being fixed in place as by some firm attachment. <i>The dyes differ in their <b>fastness</b> to light.</i>
<b>hastily</b>	With excessive speed or urgency; hurriedly. <i>He <b>hastily</b> changed the subject.</i>
<b>hurried</b>	Moving rapidly or performed quickly or in great haste. <i>I ate a <b>hurried</b> breakfast.</i>
<b>hurriedly</b>	In a quick or rushed manner. <i>The way they buried him so <b>hurriedly</b> was disgraceful.</i>
<b>hurry</b>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i><b>Hurry</b> it s late.</i>
<b>instantaneous</b>	Occurring with no delay. <i>Modern methods of <b>instantaneous</b> communication.</i>
<b>nimble</b>	Quick and light in movement or action; agile. <i>With a deft motion of her <b>nimble</b> fingers.</i>
<b>overhasty</b>	Excessively hasty. <i>Hard times are showing up <b>overhasty</b> mergers.</i>
<b>overrun</b>	Spread over or occupy (a place) in large numbers. <i>The pilot thinks he is braking as hard as possible but has the risk of an <b>overrun</b>.</i>
<b>proliferate</b>	Increase rapidly in number; multiply. <i>Pizza parlors <b>proliferate</b> in this area.</i>
<b>prompt</b>	The time limit for the payment of an account stated on a prompt note. <i>I set off at three thirty <b>prompt</b>.</i>
<b>promptitude</b>	The quality of acting quickly and without delay. <i>He arranges everything with extraordinary <b>promptitude</b> and foresight.</i>
<b>promptly</b>	In a punctual manner. <i>He paid the fine <b>promptly</b>.</i>
<b>quick</b>	At a fast rate quickly. <i>His <b>quick</b> reaction prevented an accident.</i>

<b>quickly</b>	At a fast speed; rapidly. <i>He works <b>quickly</b>.</i>
<b>rapid</b>	(of an action) characterized by great speed. <i>The country's <b>rapid</b> economic decline.</i>
<b>rapidly</b>	With speed. <i>The problem is <b>rapidly</b> worsening.</i>
<b>rush</b>	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. <i>A rewritten textbook was <b>rushed</b> out last autumn.</i>
<b>rushed</b>	(of a person) short of time; hurrying. <i>I'm too <b>rushed</b> to do it.</i>
<b>scramble</b>	A motorcycle race over rough and hilly ground. <i>Maybe the alcohol has <b>scrambled</b> his brains.</i>
<b>speedily</b>	Quickly or promptly. <i>Your claim will be dealt with as <b>speedily</b> as possible.</i>
<b>spry</b>	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>The old dog was so <b>spry</b> it was halfway up the stairs before we could stop it.</i>
<b>suddenly</b>	Quickly and without warning. <i>He stopped <b>suddenly</b>.</i>
<b>swift</b>	Swiftly. <i><b>Swift</b> flight of an arrow.</i>
<b>swiftly</b>	At high speed; quickly. <i>She got up and walked <b>swiftly</b> to the door.</i>
