

sharp C sharp.


Moving very fast.

proliferate

Increase rapidly in number; multiply.

Pizza parlors **proliferate** in this area.

promptThe time limit for the payment of an account stated on a prompt note.

I set off at three thirty **prompt**.

promptitude The quality of acting quickly and without delay.

He arranges everything with extraordinary **promptitude** and foresight.

promptly In a punctual manner.

He paid the fine **promptly**.

quick At a fast rate quickly.

His **quick** reaction prevented an accident.



quickly At a fast speed; rapidly.

He works quickly.

rapid (of an action) characterized by great speed.

rush Cause to move fast or to rush or race.
