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## Associations of "Spelling" (30 Words)

<b><u>acronym</u></b>	An abbreviation formed from the initial letters of other words and pronounced as a word (e.g. ASCII, NASA). <i>The word scuba is an <b>acronym</b> for s elf c ontained u nderwater b reathing a pparatus.</i>
<b>alliterate</b>	Use alliteration as a form of poetry. <i>His first and last names <b>alliterated</b>.</i>
<b>alphabet</b>	The elementary stages of any subject (usually plural). <i>The first letter of the <b>alphabet</b>.</i>
<b>antonym</b>	A word that expresses a meaning opposed to the meaning of another word in which case the two words are antonyms of each other. <i>To him the <b>antonym</b> of gay was depressed.</i>
<b>apostrophe</b>	A punctuation mark (') used to indicate either possession (e.g. Harry's book; boys' coats) or the omission of letters or numbers (e.g. can't; he's; 1 Jan. '99).
<b>bewitchment</b>	A magical spell.
<b>collocation</b>	The habitual juxtaposition of a particular word with another word or words with a frequency greater than chance. <i>The <b>collocation</b> of the two pieces.</i>
<b>correction</b>	A change that rectifies an error or inaccuracy. <i>The <b>correction</b> of his vision with eye glasses.</i>
<b>dictionary</b>	A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words with information about them. <i>The worm attempts to crack account passwords using a built in <b>dictionary</b>.</i>
<b>diphthong</b>	A digraph representing the sound of a diphthong or single vowel as in feat.
<b>etymology</b>	The origin of a word and the historical development of its meaning. <i>The decline of <b>etymology</b> as a linguistic discipline.</i>

<b>grammar</b>	A grammar school. <i>Chomskyan <b>grammar</b>.</i>
<b>homonym</b>	Two words are homonyms if they are pronounced and spelled the same way but have different meanings.
<b><u>indent</u></b>	An indenture. <i>Every <b>indent</b> in the coastline.</i>
<b>indentation</b>	The act of cutting into an edge with toothlike notches or angular incisions. <i>Coastal <b>indentations</b>.</i>
<b>orthography</b>	A method of representing the sounds of a language by written or printed symbols. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned <b>orthography</b>.</i>
<b>paragraph</b>	Divide into paragraphs as of text. <i>All her friends were <b>paragraphed</b> in last Monday's paper.</i>
<b><u>parse</u></b>	Analyze syntactically by assigning a constituent structure to (a sentence). <i>I asked a couple of students to <b>parse</b> these sentences for me.</i>
<b>punctuation</b>	Something that makes repeated and regular interruptions or divisions. <i>Satisfactory standards of handwriting spelling grammar and <b>punctuation</b>.</i>
<b>quotation</b>	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>Ensure you receive a written <b>quotation</b> covering all aspects of the job.</i>
<b><u>rhetoric</u></b>	Language designed to have a persuasive or impressive effect, but which is often regarded as lacking in sincerity or meaningful content. <i>All we have from the Opposition is empty <b>rhetoric</b>.</i>
<b>runic</b>	Relating to or consisting of runes.
<b>sentence</b>	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>His <b>sentence</b> was 5 to 10 years.</i>
<b><u>syntax</u></b>	A set of rules for or an analysis of the syntax of a language. <i>Generative <b>syntax</b>.</i>
<b>typo</b>	A typographical error.
<b>typographic</b>	Relating to or occurring or used in typography. <i>The <b>typographic</b> art.</i>
<b>ungrammatical</b>	Not conforming to grammatical rules. <i><b>Ungrammatical</b> sentences.</i>
<b>vocabulary</b>	A list of difficult or unfamiliar words with an explanation of their meanings, accompanying a piece of specialist or foreign-language text. <i>He introduced a wide <b>vocabulary</b> of techniques.</i>

**vowel**

A letter representing a vowel sound such as a e i o u.

**word**

The divine word of God the second person in the Trinity incarnate in Jesus.
