<b>lively</b>	Full of life and energy; active and outgoing. <i>A <b>lively</b> homeward passage dodging aircraft and E boats.</i>
<b>naughty</b>	Suggestive of sexual impropriety. <i>A <b>naughty</b> boy.</i>
<b>peppery</b>	(of a person) irritable and sharp-tongued. <i>Nasturtiums have a <b>peppery</b> taste.</i>
<b>picante</b>	(of food) spicy.
<b>piquant</b>	Having an agreeably pungent taste. <i>A <b>piquant</b> wit.</i>
<b>risque</b>	Suggestive of sexual impropriety. <i>A <b>risque</b> story.</i>
<b>spirited</b>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A warm hearted generous <b>spirited</b> man.</i>
<b>tangy</b>	Having a strong, piquant flavour or smell. <i>A <b>tangy</b> salad.</i>
<b>zestful</b>	Characterized by great enthusiasm and energy. <i>A <b>zestful</b> and exuberant player.</i>
<b>zesty</b>	Having an agreeably pungent taste.

<b>curry</b>	A pungent dish of vegetables or meats flavored with curry powder and usually eaten with rice. <i>I ve been eating a lot of <b>curry</b>.</i>
<b>delicious</b>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i><b>Delicious</b> home baked brown bread.</i>
<b>ferment</b>	Of a substance undergo fermentation. <i>Her mind <b>ferments</b>.</i>
<b>flavor</b>	Lend flavor to.
<b>lemon</b>	The evergreen citrus tree which produces lemons widely cultivated in warm climates. <i>A port and <b>lemon</b>.</i>
<b>palatable</b>	(of an action or proposal) acceptable or satisfactory. <i><b>Palatable</b> food.</i>
<b>pepper</b>	Climber having dark red berries peppercorns when fully ripe southern India and Sri Lanka naturalized in northern Burma and Assam. <i>He liked to play <b>pepper</b>.</i>
<b>pungency</b>	Wit having a sharp and caustic quality. <i>He commented with typical <b>pungency</b>.</i>
<b>pungent</b>	Strong and sharp. <i>The <b>pungent</b> taste of radishes.</i>
<b>saline</b>	A saline solution used in medicine. <i>I was having a <b>saline</b> transfusion day and night.</i>
<b>salt</b>	Impregnated with treated with or tasting of salt. <i>She <b>salts</b> her lectures with jokes.</i>
<b>salty</b>	Tough or aggressive. <i><b>Salty</b> language.</i>
<b>sauce</b>	Provide a sauce for something season with a sauce. <i>The stock cubes can be added to soups and <b>sauces</b>.</i>
<b>savory</b>	Any of several aromatic herbs or subshrubs of the genus Satureja having spikes of flowers attractive to bees. <i>A past that was scarcely <b>savory</b>.</i>
<b>sour</b>	Go sour or spoil. <i>The milk has <b>soured</b>.</i>

- sweet** Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub.  
*Lungfuls of the clean **sweet** air.*
- tangy** Having a strong, piquant flavour or smell.  
*A **tangy** salad.*
- taste** Have a distinctive or characteristic taste.  
*His cold deprived him of his sense of **taste**.*
- tasty** Very attractive or appealing.  
*No one messes with me I m a little bit **tasty** know what I mean.*
- vinegar** Sourness or peevishness of behaviour, character, or speech.  
*Her aggrieved tone held a touch of **vinegar**.*
- zesty** Having an agreeably pungent taste.
