Definitions of "Spire" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “spire” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A tapering conical or pyramidal structure on the top of a building, typically a church tower.*
- *The continuation of a tree trunk above the point where branching begins, especially in a tree of a tapering form.*
- *A tall tower that forms the superstructure of a building (usually a church or temple) and that tapers to a point at the top.*
- *A long tapering object.*



Synonyms of "Spire" as a noun (2 Words)

belfry A room (often at the top of a tower) where bells are hung.

steeple A spire on the top of a church tower or roof.



Usage Examples of "Spire" as a noun

- *Spires of delphiniums.*

*He liked **architectural** plants particularly large spiky palms.*
- behemoth** A huge or monstrous creature.
***Behemoths** like the brontosaurus.*
- bridge** Make a bridge across.
*New initiatives were needed to **bridge** the great abyss of class.*
- carillon** A tune played on a carillon.
- column** A vertical glass tube used in column chromatography a mixture is poured in the top and washed through a stationary substance where components of the mixture are adsorbed selectively to form colored bands.
*A **column** of tanks moved north west.*
- corinthian** Or pertaining to the Corinthian style of architecture.

elevated	Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style. <i>An elevated temperature.</i>
gangling	Tall and thin. <i>A gangling teenager.</i>
gangly	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs.
lanky	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs. <i>A lanky kid transformed almost overnight into a handsome young man.</i>
leviathan	An autocratic monarch or state. <i>It s a challenge to navigate a wheeled leviathan in rush hour traffic.</i>
lighthouse	A tower or other structure containing a beacon light to warn or guide ships at sea.
lofty	Of a noble or elevated nature. <i>Lofty mountains.</i>
masonry	Freemasonry. <i>Cracks in the finished masonry.</i>
mast	Nuts of forest trees (as beechnuts and acorns) accumulated on the ground.
obelisk	A mountain tree or other natural object resembling an obelisk in shape.
pagoda	An ornamental imitation of a Hindu or Buddhist pagoda.
pillar	Something shaped like a pillar. <i>A pillar of rock.</i>
prop	A propeller that rotates to push against air. <i>He found himself becoming the emotional prop of the marriage.</i>
pylon	A tower for guiding pilots or marking the turning point in a race. <i>Power pylons are a favorite target for terrorists.</i>
sculpture	A work of art made by sculpture. <i>A bronze sculpture.</i>
skyscraper	A very tall building of many storeys.
statuesque	(of a woman) attractively tall, graceful, and dignified. <i>Frozen statuesque attitudes.</i>
structure	Give a structure to. <i>The company s weakness is the inflexibility of its management structure.</i>
tall	A garment size for a tall person. <i>How tall are you.</i>
tower	Anything that approximates the shape of a column or tower. <i>He seemed to tower over everyone else.</i>

towering	Of imposing height; especially standing out above others. <i>Towering icebergs.</i>
trestle	Each of a pair of horizontal pieces on a sailing ship's lower mast supporting the topmast.
turret	A low armoured tower, typically one that revolves, for a gun and gunners in a ship, aircraft, fort, or tank. <i>A castle with fairy tale turrets.</i>
willowy	Bordered, shaded, or covered by willows. <i>A beautiful willowy blonde.</i>
