- (of a person) not concerned with material values or pursuits.
- Relating to religion or religious belief.
- Concerned with or affecting the spirit or soul.
- Lacking material body or form or substance-Lewis Mumford.
- Relating to or affecting the human spirit or soul as opposed to material or physical things.
- Resembling or characteristic of a phantom.
- Lacking material body or form or substance.
- Concerned with sacred matters or religion or the church.
- Having a relationship based on a profound level of mental or emotional communion.

ecclesiastic	Of or associated with a church (especially a Christian Church. <i>Ecclesiastic</i> history.
ghostlike	Resembling or characteristic of a phantom.
<u>ghostly</u>	Of or like a ghost in appearance or sound; eerie and unnatural. A ghostly face at the window.
holy	Morally and spiritually excellent. <i>Holy</i> smoke.
inner	Innermost or essential. <i>Inner</i> circles of government.
phantasmal	Resembling or characteristic of a phantom. A phantasmal presence in the room.
<u>psychic</u>	Affecting or influenced by the human mind. I could sense it I must be psychic .
psychical	Outside the sphere of physical science.
<u>psychological</u>	Relating to psychology. It was concluded that her pain was psychological .
religious	Of or relating to clergy bound by monastic vows. A member of a religious order.
sacred	Religious rather than secular. A profit oriented public to whom nothing is sacred .
spectral	Resembling or characteristic of a phantom. A spectral menacing face.
unearthly	Suggesting the operation of supernatural influences- John Galsworthy. <i>He could hear the unearthly scream of some curlew piercing the din.</i>

chiropodist	A specialist in care for the feet. She decided to train as a chiropodist .
consultant	An expert who gives advice. <i>He acted as campaign consultant to the president.</i>
counselor	A lawyer who pleads cases in court.
<u>cure</u>	A substance or treatment that cures a disease or condition. <i>Cure</i> meats.
doctor	A cool onshore breeze that blows regularly in a particular warm location. <i>He denied doctoring Stephen s drinks.</i>
<u>educator</u>	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional educator.</i>



<u>faith</u>	A particular religion. Men with strong political faith s.
<u>guru</u>	Each of the ten first leaders of the Sikh religion. A management guru .
<u>healer</u>	Something that alleviates distress or anguish. <i>His parents consulted a traditional healer for help.</i>
incorporeal	Without material form or substance. An incorporeal spirit.
<u>massage</u>	Give a massage to. <i>Massage</i> can ease tiredness.
mentor	Advise or train (someone, especially a younger colleague. Both trainees were expertly mentor ed by a site supervisor.
osteopath	A therapist who manipulates the skeleton and muscles.
podiatrist	A person who treats the feet and their ailments; a chiropodist. If a toe has a discharge it is likely infected and needs to be treated by a podiatrist .
pontiff	The head of the Roman Catholic Church. The Pope s first visit to Poland as pontiff .
preternatural	Surpassing the ordinary or normal. Autumn had arrived with preternatural speed.
protege	A person who receives support and protection from an influential patron who furthers the protege s career.
psychiatrist	A physician who specializes in psychiatry.
<u>psychology</u>	The science of mental life. The psychology of interpersonal relationships.
sane	Marked by sound judgment. Hard work kept me sane .
schizophrenia	A long-term mental disorder of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behaviour, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal relationships into fantasy and delusion, and a sense of mental fragmentation. <i>Gibraltar s schizophrenia</i> continues to be fed by colonial pride.
soul	An individual person. In the depths of her soul she knew he would betray her.
specialist	Possessing or involving detailed knowledge or study of a restricted topic. You may require specialist financial advice.



spectral	Resembling or characteristic of a phantom. A spectral menacing face.
supernatural	Supernatural forces and events and beings collectively. A supernatural being.
teacher	A personified abstraction that teaches. <i>Books were his teachers.</i>
<u>therapist</u>	A person who treats psychological problems a psychotherapist. <i>Cost is one factor keeping them from the therapist s couch.</i>
transcendenta	Relating to a spiritual realm. The transcendental importance of each person s soul.
<u>tutor</u>	Work as a tutor. A voluntary tutor in adult literacy.
