## Synonyms of "Splendor" as a noun (8 Words)

<b>brilliance</b>	Intense brightness of light. <i>The nights were dark lit only by the <b>brilliance</b> of Aegean stars.</i>
<b>brilliancy</b>	A quality that outshines the usual.
<b>grandeur</b>	The quality of elevation of mind and exaltation of character or ideals or conduct. <i>His facade of <b>grandeur</b>.</i>
<b>grandness</b>	Splendid or imposing in size or appearance. <i>Advertisers capitalize on the <b>grandness</b> and elegance it brings to their products.</i>
<b>luster</b>	A surface coating for ceramics or porcelain.
<b>lustre</b>	Ceramics with an iridescent metallic glaze lustreware. <i>A chandelier dripping with glass <b>lustres</b>.</i>



- magnificence** Splendid or imposing in size or appearance.  
*For **magnificence** and personal service there is the Queen's hotel.*
- splendour** A quality that outshines the usual.  
*The barren **splendour** of the Lake District.*

## Associations of "Splendor" (30 Words)

**beaming**

Radiating or as if radiating light.

**Beaming** parents.

**bright**

Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing reflecting a sheen or glow.

The sun was dazzlingly **bright**.

**brilliance**

A light within the field of vision that is brighter than the brightness to which the eyes are adapted.

He s played the stock market with great **brilliance**.

**brilliant**

A diamond of brilliant cut.

**Brilliant** chandeliers.

**dazzle**

Amaze or overwhelm (someone) with a particular impressive quality.

She was **dazzled** by the headlights.

<b>dazzling</b>	Extremely bright, especially so as to blind the eyes temporarily. <i>The skater s <b>dazzling</b> virtuosic leaps.</i>
<b>faintly</b>	In a faint manner; indistinctly. <i>His <b>faintly</b> ridiculous air.</i>
<b>flash</b>	A newsflash. <i>Red lights started to <b>flash</b> a warning.</i>
<b>glare</b>	Express (a feeling) by staring fiercely. <i>When Congress investigates it brings the full <b>glare</b> of publicity to the agency.</i>
<b>gleaming</b>	An appearance of reflected light. <i><b>Gleaming</b> black limousines.</i>
<b>glowing</b>	Expressing great praise. <i>He received a <b>glowing</b> report from his teachers.</i>
<b>grandeur</b>	High rank or social importance. <i>The majestic <b>grandeur</b> and simplicity of Roman architecture.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illuminated</b>.</i>
<b>incandescent</b>	Extremely angry. <i>An <b>incandescent</b> performance.</i>
<b>iridescent</b>	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>The drake s head has an <b>iridescent</b> purple sheen.</i>
<b>lambent</b>	(of light or fire) glowing, gleaming, or flickering with a soft radiance. <i>His eyes were huge and <b>lambent</b> in his starved face.</i>
<b>light</b>	A window or opening to let light in. <i>The <b>light</b> of my life.</i>
<b>lucent</b>	Glowing with or giving off light. <i>The moon was <b>lucent</b> in the background.</i>
<b>luminescent</b>	Emitting light not caused by heat. <i>There s something calming about watching a <b>luminescent</b> jellyfish.</i>
<b>luminosity</b>	The rate of emission of radiation, visible or otherwise. <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and <b>luminosity</b>.</i>
<b>luminous</b>	Softly bright or radiant. <i>He wore <b>luminous</b> green socks.</i>
<b>magnificence</b>	A title or form of address for a monarch or other distinguished person. <i>The <b>magnificence</b> of the surrounding countryside.</i>



**opalescent** Showing many small points of shifting colour against a pale or dark ground.  
*An **opalescent** sky.*

**phosphorescent** Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous.  
*The **phosphorescent** glow of decaying wood.*

**radiant** A radiant point.  
*She gave him a **radiant** smile.*

**shining** Marked by exceptional merit.  
*A **shining** example.*

**splendid** Magnificent; very impressive.  
*He was a **splendid** teacher.*

**spotlight** A beam of light projected from a spotlight.  
*The knife flashed in the **spotlight**.*

**visible** Visible imports or exports.  
***Visible** stars.*

**visual** Relating to or using sight.  
***Visual** powers.*
